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EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

1. CONTEXT OF THE PROPOSAL

• Reasons for and objectives of the proposal

The Council authorised the European Commission to negotiate, on behalf of the European Union, a new Agreement between the European Union and the Republic of The Gambia, and a Protocol setting out the fishing opportunities and financial contribution. At the end of the negotiations an Agreement and Protocol were initialled by the negotiators on 19 October 2018. The new Agreement repeals and replaces the existing Agreement which entered into force on 2 June 1987; it covers a period of six years from the date of its provisional application, renewable by tacit agreement. The new Protocol covers a period of six years from the date of provisional application laid down in Article 13, that being the date on which it is signed by the parties.

• Consistency with existing policy provisions in the policy area

The main aim of the new Agreement is to provide an updated framework taking into account the priorities of the reformed Common Fisheries Policy¹ and its external dimension, with a view to establishing a strategic partnership between the European Union and the Republic of The Gambia in the field of fisheries.

The aim of the Protocol is to grant fishing opportunities to European Union vessels in Gambian waters taking into account available scientific assessments, in particular those of the Fishery Committee for the Eastern Central Atlantic (CECAF), and in accordance with the best available scientific advice and the recommendations of the International Commission for the Conservation of Atlantic Tunas (ICCAT), within the limits of the available surplus. The Commission based its position in part on the results of a forward-looking assessment, carried out by external experts, of whether a new Agreement and Protocol should be concluded. The aim is also to enhance cooperation between the European Union and the Republic of The Gambia to promote a sustainable fisheries policy and sound exploitation of fisheries resources in the Gambian fishing zone, in the interest of both parties.

The Protocol provides for fishing opportunities in the following categories:

- 28 tuna seiners;
- 10 pole-and-line vessels;
- 3 trawlers (targeting black hake, a deep-sea demersal species).

• Consistency with other Union policies

The negotiation of a new Fisheries Partnership Agreement with The Gambia forms part of the Union's external action in relation to ACP countries and takes into account, in particular, Union objectives on respecting democratic principles and human rights.

2. LEGAL BASIS, SUBSIDIARITY AND PROPORTIONALITY

• Legal basis

The legal basis chosen is the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, Article 43(2) of which establishes the Common Fisheries Policy and Article 218(5) the relevant stage of the

procedure for the negotiation and conclusion of agreements between the Union and third countries.

- **Subsidiarity (for non-exclusive competence)**

The proposal falls under the exclusive competence of the European Union.

- **Proportionality**

The proposal is proportionate to the objective of establishing a legal, environmental, economic and social governance framework for fishing activities carried out by Union vessels in third country waters, as set out in Article 31 of the Regulation establishing the Common Fisheries Policy. It complies with those provisions as well as with those on financial assistance to third countries laid down in Article 32 of that Regulation.

3. BUDGETARY IMPLICATIONS

The annual financial contribution is EUR 550 000, based on:

- a) an annual amount for access to the fisheries resources in the Gambian fishing zone of EUR 275 000 equivalent to a reference tonnage, for highly migratory species, of 3 300 tonnes per year,
- b) support for development of the sectoral fisheries policy of The Gambia, amounting to EUR 275 000 a year. This support meets the objectives of The Gambia's national policy on the sustainable management of continental and maritime fishery resources.

4. OTHER ELEMENTS

- **Implementation plans and monitoring, evaluation and reporting arrangements**

The monitoring arrangements are provided for in the Protocol included in the new Partnership Agreement.

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, and in particular Article 43(2) thereof in conjunction with Article 218(5) thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the European Commission,

Whereas:

- (1) The Commission negotiated on behalf of the European Union a new Sustainable Fisheries Partnership Agreement between the European Union and the Republic of The Gambia ("Partnership Agreement") as well as a new Implementation Protocol to the Partnership Agreement ("the Protocol").
- (2) The Partnership Agreement and the Protocol were initialled at the end of those negotiations on 19 October 2018.
- (3) The Partnership Agreement repeals the previous Agreement that was concluded between the Government of the Republic of The Gambia and the European Economic Community on fishing off the coast of The Gambia and that entered into force on 2 June 1987.
- (4) The objective of the Protocol is to enable the European Union and the Republic of The Gambia to work more closely together to promote a sustainable fisheries policy and a responsible exploitation of fisheries resources in Gambian waters.
- (5) Article 14 of the Partnership Agreement and Article 13 of the Protocol provide for their respective provisional application from the date of their signature.
- (6) Therefore, the Partnership Agreement and the Protocol should be signed on behalf of the European Union, subject to their conclusion at a later date.
- (7) In order to ensure an expeditious start of fishing activities by Union vessels, the Partnership Agreement and the Implementation Protocol should be applied provisionally upon their signature,

HAS ADOPTED THIS DECISION:

Article I

The signature of the Sustainable Fisheries Partnership Agreement between the European Union and the Republic of The Gambia ('the Partnership Agreement') and the

Implementation Protocol thereto ‘the Protocol’) are hereby approved on behalf of the Union, subject to the conclusion of those acts.

The texts of the Partnership Agreement and Protocol are attached to this Decision.

Article 2

The Council Secretariat-General shall establish the instrument of full powers to sign the Partnership Agreement and the Protocol, subject to their conclusion, for the person(s) indicated by the negotiator of the said Agreement.

Article 3

The Agreement shall be applied provisionally, in accordance with Article 14 of the Partnership Agreement, as from the date of its signature, pending its entry into force.

Article 4

The Protocol shall be applied provisionally, in accordance with Article 13 of the Protocol, as from the date of its signature, pending its entry into force.

Article 5

This Decision shall enter into force on the day following that of its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Union*.

1.1. Objective(s)

1.1.1. General objective(s)

The negotiation and conclusion of Sustainable Fisheries Partnership Agreements (SFPAs) with third countries meet the general objective of giving EU fishing vessels access to the fishing zones of third countries and developing a partnership with those countries with a view to strengthening the sustainable exploitation of fishery resources outside EU waters.

SFPAs also ensure consistency between the principles governing the Common Fisheries Policy and the commitments made under other European policies (sustainable use of third-country resources, combating illegal, unreported and unregulated (IUU) fishing, integration of partner countries into the global economy and better political and financial governance of fisheries).

1.1.2. Specific objective(s) and ABM/ABB activity(ies) concerned

Specific objective

To contribute to sustainable fishing in non-EU waters, maintain a European presence in distant-water fisheries and protect the interests of the European fisheries sector and consumers by negotiating and concluding SFPAs with coastal states, consistent with other European policies.

ABM/ABB activity(ies) concerned:

Maritime affairs and fisheries, to establish a governance framework for fishing activities carried out by European Union fishing vessels in third country waters (SFAs) (budget line 11.03.01).

1.1.3. *Expected result(s) and impact*

Specify the effects which the proposal/initiative should have on the beneficiaries/groups targeted.

The conclusion of the Agreement and of the Protocol enables the establishment of a strategic fisheries partnership between the European Union and the Republic of The Gambia. The conclusion of the Protocol will create fishing opportunities for Union vessels in Gambian waters.

The Agreement and the Protocol will also contribute to better management and conservation of fishery resources, through financial support (sectoral support) for the implementation of programmes adopted at national level by the partner country, in particular as regards monitoring and combating illegal fishing, and support for artisanal fisheries sector.

Finally the Agreement and the Protocol will contribute to The Gambia's sustainable exploitation of its marine resources.

1.1.4. *Indicators of performance*

1.2. **Grounds for the proposal/initiative**

1.2.1. *Requirement(s) to be met in the short or long term including a detailed timeline for roll-out of the implementation of the initiative*

It is intended that the new Agreement and Implementing Protocol will apply provisionally from the date of its signature.

The new Agreement and Protocol will provide a framework for the fishing activities of the Union fleet in the fishing zone of The Gambia and will authorise EU vessel owners to apply for fishing authorisations to fish in that zone. In addition, the new Agreement and Implementing Protocol enhances cooperation between the EU and The Gambia, with a view to promoting the development of a sustainable fishing policy. It provides, in particular, for vessels to be monitored via VMS and, in future, for the electronic transmission of catch data. The sectoral support available under the Protocol will help The Gambia with its national fisheries strategy, including the fight against IUU fishing.

1.2.2. Added value of Union involvement.

If the EU does not agree a new Agreement and Implementing Protocol, this would impede the fishing activity of EU vessels, as the original Agreement contains a clause excluding fishing activities not taking place in the framework defined by a protocol to the Agreement. Consequently, the added value for the EU's long-distance fleet is explicit. The Agreement and Implementing Protocol also offer a framework for enhanced cooperation with the EU.

1.2.3. Lessons learned from similar experiences in the past

Since the last protocol dates back to 1996, there are no similar experiences in the past which can be used as a reference.

1.2.4. Compatibility with the Multiannual Financial Framework and possible synergies with other appropriate instruments

Funds provided as financial compensation for access under the SFPAs constitute fungible revenue in the national budget of The Gambia. However, funds intended for sectoral support are allocated (generally by introduction in the annual budget law) to the Ministry responsible for fisheries, as a condition for the conclusion and monitoring of SFPAs. These financial resources are compatible with other sources of funding from other providers of international funding for carrying out projects and/or programmes at national level in the fisheries sector.

The Commission (DG MARE, in collaboration with its fisheries attaché based in the region – Dakar, Senegal) will ensure regular monitoring of the implementation of the Protocol, as regards the use by operators of fishing opportunities and catch data and the respect of sectoral support conditionalities.

The FPA provides for at least one annual meeting of the Joint Committee, at which the Commission and The Gambia review the implementation of the Agreement and Protocol and, if necessary, adjust the programming and, if applicable, the financial contribution.

2.2. Management and control system(s)

Extensive dialogue is planned on the programming and implementation of the sectoral policy laid down in the Agreement and the Protocol. Joint analysis of results, as referred to in Article 6 of the Protocol, also forms part of these control methods.

In addition, the Agreement and the Protocol contain specific clauses for their suspension, on certain conditions and in given circumstancesEstimation and justification of the cost-effectiveness of the controls, and assessment of the expected levels of risk of error

2.3. Measures to prevent fraud and irregularities

The Commission undertakes to establish a political dialogue and regular coordination with the Republic of The Gambia with a view to improving the management of the Agreement and the Protocol and strengthening the EU's contribution to the sustainable management of resources. Any payment which the Commission makes under an SFPA is subject to the Commission's standard rules and budgetary and financial procedures. In particular, the bank accounts of the third countries into which the financial contribution is paid are fully identified. Article 4(8) of the Protocol lays down that the financial contribution for access is to be paid to The Gambia's Public Treasury and that the share intended for the development of the sector shall be paid into an account which is specifically for this purpose, opened with the bank of the Public Treasury of The Gambia.
