Report on second round of negotiations (Brussels, 18-19 June 1996)

- The <u>Commission representative</u> reported on the outcome of the second round of negotiations in Brussels on 18-19 June 1996. This round had been inconclusive and mainly concentrated on the examination of a draft text. The Venezuelan party had not had a specific mandate and had expressed the wish for a third round of negotiations.
- The <u>Commission representative</u> specified that an eventual Agreement with Venezuela would
 not be of the same importance as the current Agreement with Argentina given that the
 opportunities which are offered to the Community are not of the same importance.
- The Venezuelan party had indicated that it was not interested in a system of classical licences for the tuna seiner category, wishing to exclude it from the Protocol to any future Agreement.
- 4. The <u>French delegation</u> expressed its concern at the risk of losing tuna possibilities and stressed the importance of an eventual Agreement with this country as far as its overseas territory of Guyana is concerned; it maintained its request for 15 tuna seiners.
- The <u>Commission representative</u> indicated that the Venezuelan authorities would be examining certain types of fisheries and gear with the Guyana authorities.
- The <u>German delegation</u> underlined the need for the Community to ascertain whether the Community had a real interest in concluding such an Agreement given its financial implications.
- The <u>Commission representative</u> indicated that his Institution did not intend to resume discussions with Venezuela until the latter had more clearly defined the interests and needs of its fisheries sector.
