Subject: Indian Ocean Tuna Commission (IOTC): Future seat of the organisation

- Following an earlier initial discussion on 15 July last(¹), the Working Party reverted to the issue of the location of the seat of the IOTC in preparation for the extraordinary session of that body which has been convened for the first half of December 1996.
- 2. The <u>Commission representative</u> indicated that during that session a decision is expected to be taken regarding the future seat of the IOTC. In these circumstances, he considered it appropriate that the Community adopt a common position on that issue a view echoed by the <u>French delegation</u> and he invited delegations to indicate which of the two candidatures they supported, Sri Lanka (Colombo) or Seychelles (Victoria).
- 3. Delegations took the following positions:
 - the <u>Finnish</u>, <u>French</u>, <u>Italian and</u>, <u>provisionally</u>, <u>the United Kingdom</u> delegations expressed their preference for the candidature of the Seychelles. The <u>Dutch delegation</u> expressed a similar view but was ready to follow the majority;
 - on the other hand, the <u>Belgian</u>, <u>German and Greek</u> delegations were in favour of Sri Lanka;
 - the <u>Danish</u>, <u>Irish</u>, <u>Spanish</u> and <u>Portuguese</u> delegations were ready to rally to the majority view;
 - the Swedish delegation indicated that it had not yet adopted a definitive position.
- The Commission took note of these views, and it was agreed to revert to the issue at a future meeting of the Working Party.
