Subject : - Proposal for a Decision of the European Parliament and of the Council on the mobilisation of the European Globalisation Adjustment Fund in accordance with point 28 of the Interinstitutional Agreement of 17 May 2006 between the European Parliament, the Council and the Commission on budgetary discipline and sound financial management (application EGF/2011/011 AT/Soziale Dienstleistungen from Austria)
- Proposal for transfer of appropriations No DEC 46/2012 within Section III - Commission - of the general budget for 2012

1. The Commission submitted to the Council a proposal for a Decision of the European Parliament and of the Council on the mobilisation of the European Globalisation Adjustment Fund (EGF), as recorded in document 15240/12 FIN 798 SOC 849, accompanied by the corresponding proposal for transfer of appropriations No DEC 46/2012 within Section III - Commission - of the general budget for 2012, as recorded in document 15241/12 FIN 799.

2. The proposal aims at mobilising an amount of EUR 5 200 650 under the EGF to meet an application from Austria to deploy the Fund in connection with redundancies in the mobile social services sector. Due to the considerable efforts in consolidating its budget, the region of Styria had to undertake substantial cuts in the provision of social services as a result of a global financial and economic crisis.

The purpose of the proposed transfer is to move an amount of EUR 5 200 650 in commitment appropriations from Article 40 02 43 (*Reserve for the European Globalisation Adjustment Fund*) to Article 04 05 01 (*European Globalisation Adjustment Fund*). The necessary payment appropriations will be made available through draft amending budget No 6/2012.

3. At the simplified trilogue procedure provided for in Point 28 of the Interinstitutional Agreement of 17 May 2006, an agreement was reached on the mobilisation of the EGF and on the amount proposed by the Commission.
4. The Budget Committee examined both proposals at its meeting on 5 November 2012.
5. Following that examination, the Budget Committee agreed, by a qualified majority to suggest that the Permanent Representatives Committee advise the Council to:
 - adopt the Decision on the mobilisation of the EGF, as set out in document 15240/12, following the adoption of amending budget No 6/2012;
 - approve the proposed transfer of appropriations, as set out in document 15241/12;
 - approve the annexed draft letter to the European Parliament and to the Commission to that effect.
