Commission Statement

The Commission welcomes the first reading agreement between the European Parliament and the Council on the Safeguards Regulation.

As envisaged in the Regulation, the Commission will present a yearly report to the European Parliament and the Council on the implementation of Part IV of the EU-Central America Association Agreement and will be ready to discuss with the responsible committee of the European Parliament any issues arising from the implementation of Part IV of the Agreement. The Commission will attach particular importance to the effective implementation of commitments on trade and sustainable development in the EU-Central America Association Agreement, taking into account the specific information provided by the relevant monitoring bodies of the fundamental Conventions of the International Labour Organisation and the multilateral environmental agreements listed in Title VIII of Part IV of the EU-Central America Association Agreement. In this context, the Commission will also seek the views of the relevant civil society advisory groups. After the expiry of the Banana Stabilisation Mechanism on 31 December 2019, the Commission will assess the situation of the EU banana market and the state of EU banana producers. The Commission will report its findings to the European Parliament and the Council and would include a preliminary assessment of the functioning of the POSEI in preserving the banana production in the EU.

Joint Declaration of the Commission and the European Parliament

The Commission and the European Parliament agree on the importance of close cooperation in monitoring the implementation of Part IV of the EU-Central America Association Agreement and the Safeguard Regulation. Towards this end they agree on the following:

- Upon request by the responsible committee of the European Parliament, the Commission shall report to it on any specific concerns relating to the implementation by Central America of their commitments on Trade and Sustainable Development.
- In case the European Parliament adopts a recommendation to initiate a safeguard investigation, the Commission will carefully examine whether the conditions under the Regulation for ex-officio initiation are fulfilled. In case the Commission considers that the conditions are not fulfilled, it will present a report to the responsible committee of the European Parliament including an explanation of all the factors relevant to the initiation of such an investigation.
