- On 15 October 2010, the final plenary of the fifth meeting of the Conference of the Parties serving as the Meeting of the Parties to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety (Nagoya, 11-15 October 2010) successfully adopted the Nagoya-Kuala Lumpur Supplementary Protocol on Liability and Redress to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety.
- The <u>Council</u> welcomed, at its meeting of 20 December 2010, the adoption of the Supplementary Protocol and, on 11 May 2011, the European Union signed the Supplementary Protocol, subject to its conclusion at a later date.
- 3. The <u>Commission</u> submitted the above proposal to Council on 5 June 2012.

- 4. The <u>Council</u>, on 4 October 2012, requested the consent of the European Parliament on the text of the Supplementary Protocol (doc. 13583/12 ENV 693 WTO 294 ONU 110 AGRI 558 OC 480) as finalised by the legal-linguistic experts, with a view to the later adoption of the Council Decision on the conclusion of the Protocol.
- 5. At its Plenary meeting on 16 January 2013, the <u>European Parliament</u> gave its consent to the conclusion of the Protocol.
- Consequently, the <u>Committee of Permanent Representatives</u> is invited to suggest that the <u>Council</u>, at a forthcoming session, adopts its Decision on the conclusion of the Nagoya-Kuala Lumpur Supplementary Protocol on Liability and Redress to the Cartagena Protocol on Biosafety (doc. 13582/12 ENV 692 WTO 293 ONU 109 AGRI 557 OC 479).
