The <u>Council</u> welcomes the Court's opinion that, in all material respects, the Executive Agency's annual accounts present fairly its financial position as at 31 December 2011 and the results of its operations and its cash flows for 2011, in accordance with the provisions of the Executive Agency's Financial Regulation and the accounting rules adopted by the Commission's Accounting Officer, and that the underlying transactions for 2011 are legal and regular. However, some observations need to be made.

Even if some progress has been made over the years, the Council is concerned about the overestimation of staff expenditure and it urges the Executive Agency and the Commission to adopt a more realistic approach when planning the budget.

The Council calls on the Executive Agency to continue to reinforce its internal controls to avoid any possible overpayment.

Even if some progress has been made over the years, the Council calls on the Executive Agency to respect the principle of annuality, the Court having noticed that a large part of the appropriations carried over to 2011 were cancelled in 2011.

The Council also calls on the Executive Agency to respect the principle of specification as the Court has pointed out that many budget transfers were made at the end of the year in order to significantly increase the appropriations for IT and operational expenditure.

Finally, the Council encourages the Executive Agency to pursue its efforts to address the shortcomings detected by the Court in its staff recruitment procedures.
