Subject:	Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on Access to Genetic Resources and the Fair and Equitable Sharing of Benefits Arising from their Utilization in the Union - Orientation debate

- 1. The <u>Commission</u> submitted the above-mentioned proposal to the Council on 25 October 2012.
- 2. The Working Party on the Environment (WPE) started the examination of the proposal in the past semester. The <u>Presidency</u> has already prepared two compromise texts that were discussed by the Working Party. At this stage of discussions, the <u>Presidency</u> considers it useful to hold an orientation debate so as to steer further work within the Council. With this objective, the <u>Presidency</u> presents two questions in order to guide the ministerial debate.

- 3. The <u>Committee of Permanent Representatives</u> is invited to consider the questions prepared by the Presidency as set out in the <u>Annex</u> to this Note, and to submit them to Council with a view to the orientation debate at its meeting on 21 March 2013.
- 4. The <u>Presidency</u> encourages delegations to send written replies before the Council meeting and, where possible, to make joint interventions during the Council meeting.

Questions for Ministers

- 1. Do you consider that the obligations of users contained in the legislative proposal adequately reflect the requirements of the Nagoya Protocol with regard to user compliance in the Union? Will they contribute to the aim of effective implementation of benefit sharing arrangements?
- 2. In your view and in the light of the Nagoya Protocol, is the proposed balance between the obligations of users and the monitoring of these obligations by Member States appropriate in order to ensure the use within the Union of genetic resources accessed in accordance with relevant requirements?
