Subject:	Proposal for a Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Directive 2011/92/EU of the assessment of the effects of certain public and private projects on the environment - Orientation debate

I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

The <u>Commission</u> submitted the above-mentioned proposal on 26 October 2012. The
objective of the proposed Directive is to streamline the environmental assessments,
enhance the quality elements of the EIA process and reinforce its effectiveness.
Furthermore, the proposal intends to enhance policy coherence and synergies with other
EU law instruments.

The proposed amending provisions foresee in particular to introduce a "one-stop shop" for environmental assessments under various Union legislative acts, establish further details of the screening procedure, render scoping mandatory, set more detailed provisions on the verification of the EIA report and the content of the final decision and introduce monitoring measures.

- The vote in the ENVI Committee in the <u>European Parliament</u> is currently scheduled for 10 July 2013. The <u>Economic and Social Committee</u> adopted its opinion on 13 February 2013 (CESE 2482-2012). The <u>Committee of the Regions</u> has not yet adopted its opinion.
- 3. The <u>Working Party on the Environment</u> started its examination of the Commission proposal on 31 October 2012, and continued at several meetings, most recently on 18 February 2013, also including the examination of the impact assessment.

II. QUESTIONS FOR THE ORIENTATION DEBATE

- 4. On the basis of the discussions so far, including written comments submitted by delegations, and with a view to obtaining guidance for further work, the <u>Presidency</u> has drafted the questions set out in the <u>Annex</u> to this document for the orientation debate in Council on 21 March.
- 5. The <u>Presidency</u> encourages delegations to send written replies before the Council meeting and, where possible, to make joint interventions during the Council meeting.

Revised Questions concerning the draft Proposal for a Directive amending the Environmental Impact Assessment ("EIA") Directive

- 1. Do Member States agree with the proposal to introduce an obligation for a joint or coordinated assessment of a project under one competent authority in all cases, where the obligation to assess its effects on the environment arises from various Union legislative instruments?
- 2. Do Member States consider that the scoping of the environmental impact assessment by the competent authority should be mandatory in all cases as foreseen in Article 5 of the proposal?
- 3. Do Member States think that the proposal for a system of accredited experts entitled to draw up an environmental report is necessary to ensure the quality such reports?
