- Executive Summary

On page 17, chapter "Euro Counterfeiting" paragraph 2 of document ST 7368/13 INIT:

"In 2012, a total of 518 548 counterfeit euro banknotes and 114 676 counterfeit euro coins were seized and removed from the circulation. These figures represent a decline from 2011 and 2010 and confirm a trend decreasing quantity and value of counterfeit euro banknotes and coins. Euro counterfeiting however has also seen an evolution towards 'easily' available hologram emulations and more deceptive counterfeits."

"In 2012, a total of **575 510** counterfeit euro banknotes and **188 323** counterfeit euro coins were seized. **Compared with 2011, this represents a decrease in terms of** quantity and value of counterfeit euro banknotes **and an increase of about 15% in the total number of counterfeit coins**. Euro counterfeiting however has also seen an evolution towards 'easily' available hologram emulations and more deceptive counterfeits."
