Subject: Amendment No 2 to the Three-year Action Programme for the African Peace

Facility, 2011-2013 (10th EDF)

### I. <u>Introduction</u>

- 1. The ACP-EU African Peace Facility (APF) was created on 11 December 2003 by Decision No 3/2003 of the ACP-EC Council of Ministers<sup>1</sup> and financed initially by the 9th European Development Fund (EDF).
- 2. Under the 10th EDF, EUR 300 million were earmarked for funding the APF for the period 2008-2010<sup>2</sup>.

- 3. To finance the African Peace Facility for the period 2011-2013, an initial amount of EUR 300 million was released in May 2011<sup>3</sup>, and an additional amount of EUR 126.2 million was released in September 2012<sup>4</sup>.
- 4. The Commission and the EEAS estimate that with current resources, the APF could only provide funding until 31 May 2013. After that date, the APF envelope for Peace Support Operations (PSO) would be depleted.
- 5. A second replenishment of the APF for the period 2011-2013 is urgent in order to continue to provide funding for the remaining seven months of 2013. Therefore, it is proposed to replenish the APF PSO envelope with an additional EUR 115 million from the 10th EDF reserves, channelled through the Regional Indicative Programme for Eastern and Southern Africa-Indian Ocean.

## II. Three-year Action Programme for the APF, 2011-2013, and 2nd amendment for 2012-2013

6. In accordance with Article 12 of the 10th EDF Implementation Regulation<sup>5</sup>, the Commission has drawn up an Action Programme for 2011 to 2013 concerning the implementation arrangements of the African Peace Facility.

The Action Programme sets out specific procedures for implementation, and serves as a basis for the financing agreement concluded between the Commission and the African Union.

- 7. The current Action Programme for 2011-2013<sup>6</sup> was amended a first time to include the additional amount of EUR 126.2 million released in September 2012. In order to include an additional EUR 115 million to cover 2012-2013 needs, the Commission proposed a second amendment to the Action Programme which was:
  - discussed and agreed by the ACP Working Party on 25 March 2013, and
  - endorsed by the Political and Security Committee on 26 March 2013.
- 8. Coreper is invited to approve by a <u>qualified majority</u> as defined in Article 8(3) of the Internal Agreement<sup>7</sup>, the text of the amendments to the Action Programme <u>as set out in document 7770/13</u>, it being understood that, in application of Article 12(b) of the Regulation on the implementation of the 10th EDF, the text will be forwarded to the Commission for adoption<sup>8</sup>.
