Subject :	Proposal for transfer of appropriations No DEC 07/2013 within Section III - Commission - of the general budget for 2013

 On 16 April 2013, the Commission submitted to the Council proposal for transfer of appropriations No DEC 07/2013.

The purpose of this proposal is to transfer an amount of EUR 65 million in commitment and EUR 19.5 million in payment appropriations from Article 40 02 42 (*Emergency aid reserve*) to Article 23 02 01 (*Humanitarian aid*), as recorded in document 8475/13 FIN 192.

- 2. The transfer is being proposed in order to provide humanitarian assistance to respond to the increased needs in the crisis in Syria with an amount of EUR 65 million.
- 3. The Budget Committee examined the proposal for a transfer at its meeting on 19 April 2013.

- In accordance with the provisions of Point 25 of the Interinstitutional Agreement of 17 May 2006, a simplified trilogue was held on the Commission proposal.
- 5. Following that examination, the Budget Committee agreed, by a qualified majority, to suggest that the Permanent Representatives Committee advise the Council to approve:
 - the proposed transfer of appropriations;
 - the draft letter in ANNEX to that effect.
