1. On 19 September 2013, the Commission submitted to the Council proposal for transfer of appropriations No DEC 22/2013.

The purpose of this proposal is to transfer an amount of EUR 18 million in commitment appropriations from Article 05 05 02 (Instrument for Pre-accession Assistance for Rural Development (IPARD)) to Article 22 02 01 (Transition and institution-building assistance to candidate countries), as recorded in document 13820/12 FIN 540.

2. The transfer is being proposed to support a limited number of rural infrastructure projects in FYROM.
