Currently UK Permanent Representative to the EU, effective from 9th January 2012.

July 2007 – December 2011: Prime Minister's Advisor on Europe and Global Issues and the UK Sherpa for the G8 and G20. Cabinet Office Permanent Secretary responsible for EU coordination.

2002 – 2007: Second Permanent Secretary at HM Treasury, Managing Director of the Macroeconomic and International Finance Directorate. Responsible for UK macroeconomic policy, international and EU policy and financial services. UK representative on the EU Economic and Finance Committee, Chair of the EFC sub committee on the IMF (SCIMF), Chair of the Committee of IMF Deputies, and UK G7 and G20 Deputy. Government representative Bank of England Monetary Policy Committee.

2000-2002: Managing Director for Financial Regulation, HM Treasury.

1990 – 2000: various HM Treasury posts on EU and international finance and leading the Treasury's work on operational independence of the Bank of England; European Monetary Union; and the international financial system.

1980 – 1990: Various posts in the British government department of Environment and Transport, including dealing with EU environment and transport policy issues.
