The Chairman debriefed <u>the Committee</u> on the outcome of the trilogue on 31 January 2012 followed by an exchange of views on the way forward in restricted format. <u>The Committee</u> agreed to return to this item at its forthcoming meeting.

<u>The Committee</u> took stock of the information provided by the Presidency concerning the General Affairs Council on 27 January 2012, which was focused on the new Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF).

- 30. Council Decision authorising the Commission to open negotiations on behalf of the European Union for a new protocol to the Fisheries Partnership Agreement with the Kingdom of Morocco
 - Presidency compromise 5724/12 PECHE 29 + REV 1

The Committee endorsed by qualified majority the approach proposed by the Presidency in its note (doc. 5724/1/12 REV 1). The UK, SE, IE, DE, FI, NL and SI expressed a preference for the explicit mention of the waters off Western Sahara in the mandate, in relation to the protection of the rights of the local populations in that area. Of these delegations, the UK and SE were opposed to the compromise; FI and NL declared their intention to abstain, the latter also raising additional requests that had not been addressed by the compromise (maximum sustainable yield; ship-owner fees). The other delegations were prepared to align themselves with the compromise in order not to delay the re-launch of negotiations with Morocco. On request by DE, the Presidency confirmed that the compromise text was fully taking into account the European Parliament's resolution of December 14, 2011 and that the Committee minutes will state the views of delegations in relation to the fishing waters off the Western Sahara. There was broad agreement that the ensuing negotiations would have to be conducted in a way that the EP's opinion is catered for.

IE, FI, NL and SE requested to include statements in the Council's minutes.

<u>The Commission</u> expressed its readiness to support the compromise, while regretting that a reference to negotiation options in addition to reporting requirements had been deleted.

<u>The Committee</u> took note of the information given by the Presidency and the Commission on the informal European Council; the meeting on 30 January 2012 focused on the growth and jobs agenda, the Single Market (standardisation, energy efficiency, simplification of accounting requirements, e-signature, roaming, outstanding issues in the patent package) and SMEs.

Follow-up to the informal meeting of Members of the European Council on 30 January 2012 (Coreper I)

= Information from the Commission

The Presidency presented the issues of the 30 January 2011 Heads of State and Government statement which are relevant to Coreper I noting, in particular, the work required on the energy efficiency directive, including a possible early discussion in Coreper. The Commission informed on the bilaterals held under the European semester and underlined the importance of the mid-April deadline for National Reform Programmes. It also informed on the follow-up of the January Heads of State and Government meeting as regards youth unemployment and support to small and medium-sized enterprises, notably on the action teams established for the 8 Member States worst affected by youth unemployment. The discussion centered on youth unemployment and the digital single market.
