Subject: Declaration of the Republic of Finland in accordance with Article 36(2) of Council Decision 2008/615/JHA

Sir,

I have the honour to submit the following declaration:

"In accordance with Article 36(2) of Council Decision 2008/615/JHA, the Republic of Finland informs the General Secretariat of the Council of the national DNA analysis files to which Articles 2 and 6 apply.

The national DNA database is based on the CODIS (Combined DNA Index System), which was installed at the National Bureau of Investigation Finland in 1999 by officers of the FBI (United States).

From this database the following types of profiles are extracted for exchange and comparison with other European countries:

- Forensic: genetic profile obtained from a specimen of unknown origin unidentified generally a specimen obtained from evidence associated with a criminal act.
- Offender: genetic profile obtained from a known person. DNA profiles from suspects, arrestees and convicted persons are included."
