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1. Adoption of the provisional agenda

3. **CAP reform (Greening):**

Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council (a) establishing rules for direct payments to farmers under support schemes within the framework of the common agricultural policy

The SCA discussed the mandatory greening components of the proposal (crop diversification, permanent grassland and Ecological Focus Area), as well as GAEC, cross compliance and sanctions with a view to preparing the orientation debate in the Council on 14-15 May 2012.

The <u>SCA</u> took note of the Presidency's summary, the main points of which were as follows:

on **crop diversification**, a majority of delegations requested greater flexibility including for a higher area threshold and for a reduced number of crops. Several delegations indicated that the proportion of grassland on the farm should be taken into account. On the definition of "crop", there was broad support for the view that as an essential element, "crop" needed to be defined in the basic act; a preference for an adjusted wider scope was also noted. Delegations took note of the Commission services working document (doc 8792/12). Comments and suggestions on other points were also noted, together with the Commission's reaction.

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- on <u>permanent grassland</u>, the Presidency noted support for its suggested adjustment to the proposed definition of permanent grassland as well as the suggestions made by a <u>number of delegations</u> for further adjustment, the reserves made by <u>others</u>, as well as the willingness expressed by the <u>Commission representative</u> to look carefully at this issue. The Presidency also noted that a <u>majority of delegations</u> called for the requirement to maintain permanent grassland to continue to apply at regional or national level.
- on <u>Ecological Focus Area</u>, a <u>majority of delegations</u> considered that the proposed percentage was too high and that the scope was too narrow. On further types of areas to be included in the basic act, the suggestions made by <u>delegations</u> were noted. On the appropriate level for this measure, a <u>considerable number of delegations</u> preferred it to be at regional and/or national level. The Presidency further noted the calls from <u>several delegations</u> for a minimum farm area threshold. Delegations took note of the Commission services working document (doc 8791/12). The Commission reaction was noted.

The <u>Presidency</u> announced that the <u>SCA</u> would continue its discussions on the proposal at its next meeting on 30 April 2012, with focus on the effect of greening and the baseline for support in Pillar II and on possible alternatives to the mandatory greening measures proposed by the Commission.

(b) Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council on the financing, management and monitoring of the common agricultural policy (the horizontal regulation)
