The Committee heard the report back from the negotiations amongst developed countries held in Geneva on 13 May 2012 on the seats of the Green Climate Fund Board. It agreed that the outcome of these negotiations, including the role of the Commission, should be preserved. To this end, the draft Council conclusions nominating a member of the Commission to represent the EU would need to be finalised shortly, taking into account the comments made. Finally, it agreed that more time was needed to convince the Russian Federation of the legal soundness of this solution and that in the end the EU would need to avoid being seen as blocking a solution.

20. Proposal for a Directive of the European Parliament and of the Council on alternative dispute resolution for consumer disputes and amending Regulation (EC) No 2006/2004 and Directive 2009/22/EC (Directive on consumer ADR) (First reading) (Legislative deliberation)

The Committee discussed the Presidency text (doc. 9124/12). Delegations focused on the politically essential issues of Chapters I and II and showed flexibility on the difficulties they still have with regard to these issues, proposing alternative wording.

The Presidency took note of the comments made by delegations, committed to present another compromise text which would reflect such comments and called on delegations to be also flexible at the Working Party of 10 May 2012.

At the end of the brief exchange that took place the Chair could conclude that the Committee has given him a mandate for the third informal trilogue on the basis of the text set out in 9137/12, complemented with a change in recital 7 proposed by the Lithuanian delegation. The Chair also concluded that the Committee could in principle agree to a proposal for a technical correction on recital 15 as proposed by the Commission, but that the Commission would have to present this proposal at the informal trilogue meeting.

The Committee had an exchange of views on the section of the Negotiating Box relating to Headings 1 (except cohesion and CEF), 3, 4, 5 and to horizontal issues.

The Committee exchanged views on the outstanding issues.

As regards the reference to national minorities, it was agreed to work further on the basis of the Presidency proposal and to supplement it with a possible declaration clarifying the question of competencies in the light of the explanations relating to the Charter of Fundamental Rights.

Concerning the exclusion of police cooperation and judicial cooperation in criminal matters, the Presidency concluded that the Presidency compromise proposal was a good way forward. The Council would make a declaration upon the adoption of the Decision with a commitment to re-examine this question in the context of the review of the FRA Regulation.

As regards parliamentary scrutiny reservations, DE stated that their reservation did not preclude sending the text to the European Parliament for consent whereas CZ/UK reserved their positions on this for a later stage.

37. Follow-up to the Council meeting (Justice and Home Affairs) on 26/27 April 2012

The Committee was informed of the results of the Council by referring in particular to the discussions on the PNR and the follow-up of the Schengen Governance, Readmission agreements and the draft Council conclusions on the Global Approach to Migration and Mobility. The Presidency also informed the Committee on the discussion held at lunch by the Interior and the Justice Ministers.

38. Reform of the Statute of the Court of Justice
- Information from the Presidency

The Presidency briefly informed the delegations of the state of play and of its intention to come back to the Committee on this issue the following week in view of the preparation for an informal trilogue with the European Parliament.

39. Follow-up to the Council meeting (Economic and Financial Affairs) on 2 May 2012

During the breakfast, the Council took note of the information provided by the Chair of the EBRD Board of Governors on the selection process of the next EBRD President.

At the ECOFIN itself, the Council took note of written and oral reports on the outcome of the G20 and IMF Spring meetings of 19-22 April 2012.

On the main item, the revised capital requirements rules (CRD IV), the Council held an extensive debate on the latest Presidency proposal for a general approach. Following the debate the Presidency announced that the compromise text, as amended during the meeting, would be submitted to the ECOFIN Council on 15 May 2012 for confirmation following technical verification.

Myanmar/Burma

The Committee noted that the discussion would be a follow-up to the April FAC discussion, with particular focus on how to phase in development cooperation and how to coordinate between the EU and its Member States. No Council conclusions are foreseen.

Afghanistan

The Committee noted that the May FAC discussion would follow-up on the one held at the April FAC. Council conclusions to be adopted would be aimed at giving guidance for the upcoming high level meetings (Chicago, Kabul, Tokyo).

(poss.) Pakistan

The Committee agreed to postpone the discussion until the June FAC, in time for the visit of the High Representative to Islamabad (date tbc).

42. EU-Mexico Summit (18 June 2012)

- Orientation debate

The Committee held an exchange of views regarding the approach and objective of the Summit, on the basis of a note issued under the responsibility of the EEAS and in close cooperation with the Commission. The 6th EU-Mexico Summit would be held in Los Cabos, Mexico, on 17 June 2012 in the margins of the G-20 Summit, two weeks before the Mexican presidential elections. Delegations indicated their priorities, most notably on the review of the EU-Mexican Global Agreement, the Joint Executive Plan, Mexico's internal security situation and human rights issues, environment, climate change, international economic issues/G20 and regional integration in Latin America, in particular "Alianza del Pacífico" and CELAC (Community of Latin American and Caribbean countries). On Trade and investment issues, Member States concurred on the need to convey their concern over protectionist tendencies in Latin America and strive for an investment-friendly climate in the region. The preparation of the Summit would be included at the Foreign Affairs Council on 14 May 2012 and the Committee would come back to this issue before the Summit.

- **Any other business**

- **Revision of the Gothenburg Protocol (Convention on Long-range Transboundary Air Pollution - CLRTAP)**

AT, joined by FI and LUX, informed the Committee of the difficulties they were facing with regard to the values proposed by the Commission for a number of pollutants at the negotiations for the revision of the Gothenburg Protocol, currently taking place in Geneva, at the 30th session of the CLRTAP Executive Body. The Commission maintained a strict position focusing on the implementation of the EU acquis and on the need for the EU not to appear divided in the context of an international negotiation, but - instead - address the concerns raised in the context of a forthcoming revision of the NEC Directive. NL supported the Commission's approach. The Chair invited all delegations to display flexibility, in order not to have the EU blocking the entire GP negotiations, which were to be concluded the following day, as per the agreed schedule. The Committee took note of the information presented by AT, FI and LUX.

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
