OUTCOME OF PROCEEDINGS

from:Working Party on Customs Unionon:14 June 2012Subject:Implementation of the Customs Union and relations with third countries and
international organisations in customs matters

<u>The Working Party</u> held a debate on the basis of the above document and of additional drafting suggestion prepared by the Presidency.

<u>The Chair</u>, having invited delegations to lift their outstanding reservations on these texts by 15 June 2012, indicated that the Presidency intended to request to Coreper, at one of its forthcoming meetings, a mandate to negotiate with the representatives of the European Parliament and of the Commission in the context of informal trialogues in view of reaching a rapid agreement.

<u>The IT delegation</u> requested the following statement to be recorded in the present outcome of proceedings:

Statement of the Italian Customs Agency on the Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council concerning customs enforcement of intellectual property rights

Italy congratulates the Danish Presidency on the excellent work carried out and aimed at reaching a compromise on the proposal for a new Regulation replacing the Council Regulation (EC) No 1383/2003, which required every one of us to get involved in a long, burdensome and complex work.

In the spirit of good cooperation and common efforts, Italy accepts the unexpected deletion of the term "transhipment" from Article 1(1)(b) of the above-mentioned text, even though it appeared that almost all Member States intended to keep it.

In this regard, we would stress that the control activity carried out by the competent customs authority would definitely have benefited from the retention of the term "transhipment" in the text and that the reference to Articles 37 and 38 of Regulation (EEC) No 2913/1992 alone does not provide for strong enough controls in such situations.

In the light of the above considerations and for all operational purposes, Italy considers that Article 1(1)(b) includes transhipment.

<u>The DE delegation</u> requested the following statement to be recorded in the present outcome of proceedings:

As part of the compromise in connection with entry into force of the Regulation, it was concluded that the 12 months remained, but that the database (COPIS) could be applied as soon as it is in place. The launch of COPIS will however be coordinated in the Customs Code Committee, sector IPR enforcement and the Electronic Customs Group - COPIS/EOS, in particular with Member States with existing national systems that need to be amended beforehand. So no legal requirements enter into force without agreement reached in the Customs Code Committee, sector IPR enforcement on the date that COPIS is put in place.

Following the meeting on 30 May 2012, at the request of the NL Delegation, the following text is to be inserted in the present outcome of proceedings:

The interpretation of the scope of Recital 6a is as follows:

Recital 6a refers to the Declaration on the TRIPS Agreement and Public Health adopted on 14 November 2001 by the Fourth WTO Ministerial Conference, Doha, Qatar. In line with the Declaration's objectives and its implementation, Recital 6a should be interpreted as concerning any product of the pharmaceutical sector needed to address public health problems as referred to in the Declaration, including active ingredients necessary for its manufacture and diagnostic kits needed for its use, without prejudice to the meaning of any of those terms under other pieces of Union legislation.
