3. Women on Company Boards

- Policy debate

<u>The Council</u> held a policy debate on the basis of the Presidency Note in doc. 5956/12 + COR 1. <u>Ministers</u> identified various barriers to increasing the number of women on company boards, including gender stereotypes, the lack of care services for children and other dependants, and the unequal sharing of domestic and family responsibilities. <u>Delegations</u> discussed different ways of overcoming such barriers, including measures to reconcile work, family and private life, awareness-raising, and rules and incentives for improving the gender balance at the decision-making level in the public sector, in state-owned companies, in private companies and in employers' and workers' organisations. In this context, ministers described successful measures introduced at the national level. In addition to the above-mentioned approaches, methods advocated included fostering female entrepreneurship; promoting family-friendly workplaces; improving transparency regarding the composition of company boards; and education, training and mentoring. Regarding the question as to how the gender balance on the boards of listed companies could be improved at the European level, many delegations favoured a voluntary approach, at least at this stage, while certain others were in favour of introducing binding quotas.

The Council Conclusions and the Joint Employment Report were submitted as the EPSCO Council's contribution to the European Council of 1-2 March.
