#### d) Detailed grounds for the increase

A second financial decision on Member States' control expenditure is currently being drawn up. Following the adoption of the first decision involving EUR 22 600 000 in 2012, EUR 24 800 000 currently remains on the line for allocation to the second financial decision. The Member States have asked for more than EUR 50 000 000 for this second stage of investment in controls. Their requests will have to be adapted to the appropriations available in the budget. However, the increase proposed will enable the Commission to accept a larger number of particularly interesting control projects.

#### d) Detailed grounds for the decrease

The current implementation forecasts for line 11 04 01 (Closer dialogue with the fishing industry and those affected by the common fisheries policy) suggest that the appropriations will not be fully implemented. This is mainly because of the lower than expected requirements for the communication campaign in the context of the reform of the common fisheries policy. The balance of commitment appropriations after this transfer will be sufficient to cover requirements.
