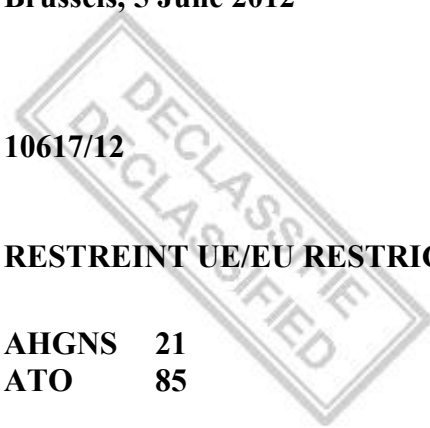

The meeting took place with the participation as observer of a representative of ENSRA's Chair and was devoted to the finalisation of the AHGNS report on the basis of the draft set out in doc. 9113/2/12 and various written comments.

Following the Chair's introduction of the draft report the AHGNS went through the draft section by section and was able to reach agreement, with minor changes, on section 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7.1. and all bullet points of section 7.2 but the last one on future work on which most of the discussion focused.

On the basis of a tentative compromise text circulated by the presidency and thanks to the constructive spirit of delegations it was possible to reach agreement on the remaining point of section 7.2. No changes were requested for Annexes I to IV and it was agreed not to retain Annex V.

The Chair could thus conclude that there was agreement on the AHGNS report on nuclear security, which would be circulated as amended.

Regarding the identical version of the report that should be made accessible to the public it was agreed to delay it until 31 May so as to facilitate Member States' adequate preparation of their communication about the report.

Regarding the next procedural steps it was recalled that, following its agreement by AHGNS, the report will be noted by Coreper, and then brought to the attention of the European Council through the appropriate channels.
