 The Commission submitted to the Council proposal for transfer of appropriations No DEC 34/2012 within Section III - Commission - of the general budget for 2012.

The purpose of this proposal is to transfer non-differentiated appropriations for a total amount of EUR 700 000 from item 15 01 04 22 (*Lifelong learning - Expenditure on administrative management*) to Article 15 02 22 (*Lifelong learning programme*) in commitments and payments, as recorded in 14881/12 FIN 744.

 The above mentioned reinforcement in commitment and payment appropriations is being proposed to allow pre-financing of projects selected in 2012 in the framework of the Lifelong learning programme.

- 3. <u>The Budget Committee</u> examined the proposal for a transfer at its meeting on 15 October 2012.
- 4. Following that examination, <u>the Budget Committee</u> agreed, by qualified majority, to suggest that the Permanent Representatives Committee advise the Council to approve:
 - the proposed transfer of appropriations;
 - the draft letter in ANNEX to that effect.
