Regulation 1927/2006 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 20 December 2006, as amended by Regulation (EC) 546/2009, establishes the European Globalisation Adjustment Fund (EGF). Point 28 of the Interinstitutional Agreement between the European Parliament, the Council and the Commission of 17 May 2006 on budgetary discipline and sound financial management sets the budgetary framework.

d) Detailed grounds for the increase

In the proposal for Decision [COM (2012) 616], the Commission concluded that the conditions for a financial contribution from the EGF to application EGF/2011/026 IT/Emilia Romagna-Motorcycles, submitted by the Italian authorities, are met.

The amount of EUR 2 658 495 requested by the Italian authorities will contribute to the cost of a coordinated package of eligible personalised services for 502 redundant workers in 10 enterprises operating in the NACE Revision 2 Division 30 ('Manufacture of other transport equipment') in the NUTS II region of Emilia-Romagna (ITH5) in Italy, providing assistance with a view to re-integrating the affected workers into the labour market.

As usual for the EGF, the payment needs are the same as the commitments amounts. Part of the payment appropriations (EUR 1 160 745) are covered by a transfer from the Microfinance Facility. The rest of the payment appropriations have been requested in the Draft Amending Budget 6/2012. The redundancies were caused by the global financial and economic crisis.

d) Detail grounds for the transfer

After the adoption by the two arms of the Budgetary Authority of the EGF cases currently in the pipeline, the available payment appropriations on the EGF budget line would be fully consumed. EUR 1 160 745 from the European Progress Microfinance Facility are available to cover part of the needs of the present EGF application. This source of financing was identified during the Global transfer exercise and was kept to be used for the EGF.

Progress Microfinance is a financial facility implemented by the European Investment Fund (EIF) on behalf of the European Commission and the European Investment Bank (EIB). It facilitates the access to micro-loans of micro-enterprises and individuals by supplying micro-credit providers in the EU Member States with guarantees or funded instruments.

The latest estimates of the EIF for the development of Progress Microfinance in 2012 show a downward revision compared to the initial forecast. As 2012 would only be the second year of full implementation of Progress Microfinance and as it operates on a relatively new market segment, the EIF is constantly improving the forecast modelling it applies. According to the EIF, the updated estimates are broadly in line with the typical pattern for the build-up of micro-credit operations.

The implementation patterns typically indicate a non-linear portfolio build-up, with a slower start followed by an increase in volume. As Progress Microfinance provides guarantees with a period of availability of usually two years, and loans for an inclusion period of two to three years, the target micro-loan volumes and numbers are expected to be reached between 2013 and 2015. Based on the enhanced market knowledge and refined modelling, the EIF indicates that the level of payments in the Progress Microfinance pipeline until the end of the year allow for the release of EUR 1 160 745.

The additional EUR 1 497 750 in payments for meeting the financing needs of the present EGF application are requested in the Draft Amending Budget 6/2012.

d) Detail grounds for the transfer

Under point 28 of the Inter-institutional Agreement of 17 May 2006 on budgetary discipline and sound financial management, the reserve for the European Globalisation Adjustment Fund is intended to provide additional support for workers who suffer from the consequences of major structural changes in world trade patterns, to assist them with their reintegration into the labour market.
