**Declaration by the High Representative on behalf of the
European Union on the alignment of certain third countries
with the Council Decision 2012/634/CFSP amending Council
Decision 2011/782/CFSP and Council Implementing Regulation
(EU) No 944/2012 concerning restrictive measures against
Syria**

On 15 October 2012, the Council adopted Decision 2012/634/CFSP¹ amending Council Decision 2011/782/CFSP and Council Implementing Regulation (EU)² No 944/2012 implementing Regulation (EU) No 36/2012.

The Decision prohibits the purchase, import or transport of arms from Syria, as well as the provision of related financing or financial assistance. Furthermore, the access of Syrian Arab Airlines to the airports of EU Member States is prohibited, in addition to the existing prohibition on access of cargo flights from Syria.

Council Decision 2012/634/CFSP and Council Implementing Regulation (EU) No 782/2012 also establish amendments to Annex I to Decision 2011/782/CFSP and Annex II to Council Regulation (EU) No 36/2012, including additional designations of persons and entities.
