This revised version will be examined by the <u>Working Party on Competitiveness and Growth</u> at its meeting on 15 November 2012. At this stage all delegations have a general scrutiny reservation.

### Revised draft COUNCIL CONCLUSIONS

### ON THE SINGLE MARKET ACT II - TOGETHER FOR NEW GROWTH

### "THE COUNCIL (Competitiveness)

#### RECALLING:

- The Conclusions of the European Council of 19 October 2012 welcoming the Commission's intention to present all key SMA II proposals by spring 2013 and calling for their rapid examination in order to allow their adoption by the end of the current parliamentary cycle at the latest;<sup>1</sup>

- The Compact for Growth and Jobs agreed at the European Council on 29 June 2012, which highlighted the need for deepening the Single Market by removing remaining barriers in particular in digital and network industries within the context of the need for urgent measures to promote growth and jobs;<sup>2</sup>

- The Commission Communication on "Single Market Act - Twelve levers to boost growth and strengthen confidence - Working together to create new growth" (SMA I) of 13 April 2011;<sup>3</sup>

- The Conclusions of the Competitiveness Council of 30 May 2011 on the priorities for relaunching the Single Market, in which Council calls on Member States and the European Parliament in close cooperation with the Commission to adopt by the end of 2012 a first set of priority measures to bring a new impetus to the Single Market;<sup>4</sup>

- The Communication from the Commission "Europe 2020 - A strategy for smart, sustainable and inclusive growth", adopted on 3 March 2010<sup>5</sup>, and the key flagship initiatives set out in it;

- The Communications from the Commission "Better Governance for the Single Market"<sup>6</sup> <u>and "A</u> <u>partnership for new growth in services 2012-2015" on the implementation of the Services</u> <u>Directive,</u><sup>7</sup> adopted on 8 June 2012;

- The European Parliament Resolutions of 14 June 2012 on a 'Single Market Act: The Next Steps to Growth<sup>8</sup>' and of 25 October 2012 on the 20 main concerns of European citizens and business with the functioning of the Single Market<sup>9</sup> in which Parliament stresses that strengthening the Single Market and underpinning it with the right economic governance should be at the core of the EU's growth agenda;

- The Opinion of the European Economic and Social Committee of 12 July 2012, which called for not only short-term but also medium and long-term measures to support growth and sustainable development<sup>10</sup>;

- The Commission Communication "Single Market Act II – Together for new growth" (SMA II) of 3 October 2012.<sup>11</sup>

- UNDERLINES that since its foundation the Single Market has generated significant growth, employment and opportunities for citizens and businesses to move, operate and invest across the EU and thereby played an important <u>a crucial</u> role in the development <u>and integration</u> of the EU.
- 2. STRESSES that the contribution to growth and employment expected from <u>a fully</u> <u>functioning</u> the further development of the Single Market is a key element of the EU response to the economic, financial and social crisis facing Europe and in promoting competitiveness. EMPHASISES that the Single Market <u>is indispensable</u> constitutes an important tool for <u>creating</u> medium <u>and long</u>-term benefits <u>and</u> opportunities and for restoring <u>consumer and business</u> confidence as well as for achieving the <del>long term</del> vision of a highly competitive social market economy.

- 3. REAFFIRMS its objective to adopt by the end of 2012 as many of the outstanding priority measures of the SMA I as possible.
- 4. CONSIDERS that the development deepening of the Single Market is a continuous exercise requiring and that further steps are necessary and, in this respect, it WELCOMES the SMA II that sets out the following four drivers and twelve key and its actions which are expected to have with significant growth and employment potential, and which reflect reflecting better regulation principles and while being in line with the Europe 2020 strategy and the Compact for Growth and Jobs decided last June.

- 5. CALLS ON the Commission to table <u>by spring 2013 at the very latest</u> the necessary <u>its</u> proposals for <u>on</u> the twelve key actions of the SMA II <u>listed in Annex and in connection</u> with this to also table a thorough impact assessment and quantification of costs and <u>benefits of the key actions in relation to growth and jobs; furthermore HIGHLIGHTS</u> the importance of appropriate monitoring and evaluation of such benefits.
- 6. INVITES ENCOURAGES the Member States and the European Parliament in close cooperation with the Commission and in a spirit of partnership to make every possible effort to adopt ensure the rapid examination of the proposals for the twelve key actions of the SMA II in order to allow their adoption by the end of the current parliamentary cycle at the latest in order so as to bring new impetus to the Single Market; in this respect INVITES the Presidency to initiate a close dialogue at an early stage with the European Parliament.

- 7. HIGHLIGHTS the importance of timely and correct transposition of Single Market legislation as well as its effective implementation and enforcement for it to become a tangible reality for all citizens and businesses and in this respect EMPHASISES the need for more realistic transposition deadlines. WELCOMES CALLS for urgent action in line with the Commission Communication to improve Single Market governance, including monitoring performance through an annual report in the framework of the European Semester process. and EMPHASISES the need for more realistic transposition deadlines. WELCOMES the Commission Communication on the implementation of the Services Directive "A partnership for new growth in services 2012-2015", and CALLS for its immediate implementation, including through rigorous peer review of national restrictions and swift action to remove unjustified barriers.
- 8. UNDERLINES that it is essential to ensure the highest quality and effectiveness of EU legislation in order to eliminate fragmentation of the Single Market, reduce administrative burden on entrepreneurs and ensure that the benefits of the Single Market are passed on to citizens and businesses; furthermore ENCOURAGES Member States to promote Single Market-friendly national legislation.
- 8.9. RECOGNISES that tackling remaining unjustified barriers in the Single Market is an exercise requiring continuous adaptation to changing social, demographic, technological, legal and other developments changes. ENCOURAGES the Commission to continue the monitoring of developments in this these areas and, in close cooperation with the EU institutions and stakeholders, to consider where further action is required to promote sustainable growth and jobs by removing remaining unjustified barriers to the four freedoms of the Treaty in the Single Market to promote growth and jobs and to while taking account of new challenges in the interest of citizens, workers, consumers and businesses and in particular SMEs.

- 10. HIGHLIGHTS the necessity for the Single Market to rest upon a strong economic and social basis and in this respect EMPHASISES the importance for the key actions of the SMA II to address the concerns of the citizens and the benefits they may draw from the Single Market. ENCOURAGES the Commission to consider further action to strengthen the contribution of the Single Market to social inclusion within the EU and ensuring that citizens have access to the rights that the Single Market offers to them.
- 9-11. STRESSES the need for its stronger role in on Single Market issues in the context of the European Semester process with regard to sustainable growth and competitiveness enhancing measures, especially with regard to including the governance of the Single Market and the adoption and implementation of the key actions of the SMA I and SMA II. Moreover, CALLS on the Commission to present its Annual Report on the integration of the Single Market for timely discussion in the Competitiveness Council and its preparatory bodies.
- 12. UNDERLINES the need to monitor closely the progress on the key proposals of the SMA I and SMA II and in this regard INVITES the Commission to present a semiannual report for discussion in the High Level Group on Competitiveness and Growth and subsequently in the Council.
