Subject:	Appointment of four members of the Management Board of the European Medicines Agency (EMA)
	- Procedure

A. INTRODUCTION

1. Article 65(1) of Regulation (EC) No 726/2004 of 31 March 2004 laying down Community procedures for the authorisation and supervision of medicinal products for human and veterinary use and establishing a European Medicines Agency provides that, in addition to one representative of each Member State, two representatives of the Commission and two representatives of the European Parliament, two representatives of patients' organisations, one representative of doctors' organisation and one representative of veterinarians' organisations shall be appointed as members of the EMA Management Board by the Council in consultation with the European Parliament on the basis of a list drawn up by the Commission. It further provides that the European Parliament may submit its views to the Council for consideration, which shall then appoint the members of the Management Board.

- 2. On 8 August 2012, the Commission adopted a Decision¹ setting out a list of candidates relating to the nomination of four members of the Management Board of the European Medicines Agency. The Commission sent the Decision to the Council and the European Parliament and also provided the curricula vitae of the candidates.
- 3. <u>The Council Secretariat</u> has sent a letter² with an Annex containing the list of candidates together with the curricula vitae of the candidates directly to the Deputy Permanent Representatives and to the Health Attachés.
- 4. An official letter³, in which the European Parliament informs the Council of which of the candidates on the list it recommends is expected to be issued shortly. The letter will list one candidate representing doctors, one candidate representing veterinarians and two candidates in order of recommendation representing patients.
- 5. <u>The Commission</u> has proposed three candidates⁴ for the post of Management Board member representing doctors. <u>The European Parliament</u> is expected to recommend one of them for appointment.
- 6. <u>The Commission</u> has proposed two candidates⁵ for the post of Management Board member representing veterinarians. <u>The European Parliament</u> is expected to recommend one of them for appointment.
- 7. <u>The Commission</u> has proposed six⁶ candidates for the post of Management Board member representing patients, of these candidates the European Parliament is expected to retain two, in order of preference, for consideration by the Council.

B. PROCEDURE

- 8. Under Article 16(3) of the Treaty on European Union⁷, a **qualified majority** is required for these appointments.
- 9. <u>The Council</u> must select one representative for doctors from three candidates, one representative for veterinaries from two candidates and two representatives for patients among five candidates.
- 10. In order to establish a simple procedure for finding out which candidates have the strongest support, it is proposed to follow the procedure outlined in point 12⁸. A decision by the Permanent representatives Committee to use that procedure could, in accordance with Article 240(3) of the Treaty on the functioning of the European Union⁹, be adopted by a simple majority of its members.
- 11. <u>The Committee</u> could then verify that <u>a qualified majority of its members</u> (255 votes in favour) could support a decision to recommend to the Council to appoint the candidates that received the strongest support.

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The Council shall act by a qualified majority except where the Treaties provide otherwise."

- 12. It is suggested that the procedure for the appointment of the representatives be as follows:
 - <u>the members of the Permanent Representatives Committee</u> will be given an opportunity to express their views on the various candidates if they wish;
 - <u>the Permanent Representatives Committee</u> will vote by secret ballot, Member States' delegations each having one vote;
 - each Member State delegation is entitled to vote for two candidates representing
 patients, one candidate representing doctors and one candidate representing
 veterinarians. <u>Delegations</u> also have the option of abstaining from voting for any
 candidate;
 - candidates' names will appear in alphabetical order on each ballot paper;
 - if at the <u>first</u> count there is a simple majority (at least fourteen votes) in favour of:
 - = one or two candidates representing patients, <u>the Committee</u> will recommend that the Council appoint this candidate / these candidates;
 - = one candidate representing doctors, <u>the Committee</u> will recommend that the Council appoint this candidate;
 - one candidate representing veterinarians, the Committee will recommend that the Council appoint this candidate;
 - concerning those posts for which there is not a simple majority (at least fourteen votes) at the first count, further ballots will be held until two candidates for patients, one candidate for doctors and one candidate for veterinarians have received fourteen votes or more. In each ballot the candidate receiving the lowest number of votes shall be eliminated.

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C. **TERM OF OFFICE**

In accordance with Article 65(4) of Regulation (EC) 726/2004 the term of office shall be 13. three years. It is suggested that the Council leave it to the Management Board to set the date on which the term of office of the persons appointed will start.

D. PUBLICATION OF THE COUNCIL DECISION

14. It is suggested that the Council Decision making this appointment be published in the Official Journal of the European Union, as is normally the case regarding such appointments.

Conclusion

The Permanent Representatives Committee is invited to

- approve the arrangements described in point 12 above;
- in accordance with point 12, establish which of the candidates representing patients, doctors and veterinarians have the strongest support;
- verify that a qualified majority can agree to recommending to the Council to appoint to the posts as member of the Management Board of the EMA the candidates selected in accordance with point 12;
- agree that the starting date of the three-year term of office of the persons to be appointed as members of the Management Board of the EMA will be set by the **Management Board**;

and to

- invite the Council to decide at a forthcoming meeting:
 - to appoint the persons thus recommended (a draft Decision for this = purpose appears in **Annex I** hereto);
 - to have the appointing Decision published in the Official Journal of the **European Union.**
