Subject:	Proposal for transfer of appropriations No DEC3/2012 within Section VI - European Economic and Social Committee - of the general budget for 2012

 The European Economic and Social Committee submitted to the Council proposal for transfer of appropriations No DEC3/2012 within Section VI - European Economic and Social Committee - of the general budget for 2012.

The purpose of this proposal is to transfer a total amount of EUR 78 179 from Article 162 (*Mission expenses*) and item 1400 (*Other staff*) to item 2100 (*Purchase, servicing and maintenance of equipment and software, and related work*).

2. This transfer would provide the supplementary appropriations necessary to enable additional investment in the IT infrastructure of both the European Economic and Social Committee and the Committee of the Regions.

- 3. <u>The Budget Committee</u> examined the proposal for a transfer at its meeting on 19 November 2012.
- 4. Following that examination, the Budget Committee agreed, by qualified majority, to suggest that the Permanent Representatives Committee advise the Council to approve:
 - the proposed transfer of appropriations;
 - the draft letter in ANNEX to that effect.
