 On <u>29 November 2012</u>, the Commission adopted a proposal for a Decision of the European Parliament and of the Council on a General Union Environment Action Programme to 2020 "Living well, within the limits of our planet".

- 2. On <u>29 November 2012</u>, the Commission presented its proposal to the Working Party on the Environment (WPE). The Presidency has drafted two questions to guide the orientation debate in Council.
- 3. The Commission will present this proposal to the Environment Committee of the European Parliament on 18 December 2012.
- Coreper is invited to consider the questions prepared by the Presidency and set out in the <u>Annex</u> to this Note, and to submit them to Council with a view to the orientation debate at its meeting on 17 December 2012.

## **Questions for Ministers**

- In your view, does the 7<sup>th</sup> EAP meet your expectations and address the shortcomings identified in the 6<sup>th</sup> EAP and adequately covers the current and emerging environmental challenges, as outlined in the Environment Council conclusions of June 2012, October 2011 and December 2010 and the European Parliament's resolution of 20 April 2012?
- 2. Do you consider that the nine priorities set out in the 7<sup>th</sup> EAP are adequate and pragmatic in terms of vision, scope and ambition for the overall programme and that the actions proposed are adequate to reach the targets set for 2020?
