Subject:	Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Council Regulation (EC) No 471/2009 on Community statistics relating to external trade with non-member countries as regards conferring of delegated and implementing powers upon the Commission for the adoption of certain measures - Political agreement

- On 8 August 2013, the <u>Commission</u> submitted to the Council and the European Parliament a proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council amending Regulation (EC) No <u>471/2009</u> on Community statistics relating to external trade with nonmember countries as regards conferring of delegated and implementing powers upon the Commission for the adoption of certain measures.
- 2. The 1st reading position of the <u>European Parliament</u> was adopted in the Plenary on 12 March 2014.

- 3. On 11 June 2014, the outcome of the discussions of the Working Group was submitted to COREPER who granted the mandate to the Presidency to start the negotiations with the European Parliament.
- 4. Two informal trilogue meetings took place on 17 November and 8 December 2014 with representatives of the <u>three institutions</u>. During the second meeting, a final compromise text, set out in doc. 16787/14, was agreed.
- 5. On 19 December 2014, <u>The Committee</u> discussed but did not endorse the final compromise set out in doc. 16787/14, mandating the Presidency to continue negotiations with Parliament notably on the open issue of the consultation of experts of the Member States by the Commission to be included in Article 1 (6) Article 10a para. 2. It was then decided to put the negotiations on this file on hold, pending on the outcome of the Inter-Institutional agreement on better law-making.
- 6. The Inter-Institutional agreement on better law-making, agreed on 15 December 2015 between the three institutions, has been adopted at EP plenary on 09/03/2016, and by the Council on 15/03/2016. The final compromise as set out in doc. 7105/16 has been redrafted accordingly.
- 7. On 21 April 2016, the <u>Chair of the Committee on International Trade Committee</u> (INTA) of the European Parliament addressed a letter to the <u>President of the Permanent Representatives Committee</u>, stating that, if the Council adopts its position at first reading in accordance with the above-mentioned compromise, he would recommend to the Plenary that the Council's position be accepted without amendment, subject to legal-linguistic verification, at Parliament's second reading.
- 8. In view of the above, the <u>Permanent Representatives' Committee</u> is invited to recommend to the Council to confirm, under the A items, the political agreement as set out in doc. 7105/16.
