#### II. Annotations

#### 1. Adoption of the agenda

The Group of Experts will be invited to adopt the session's agenda (ECE/TRANS/SC.1/GE.21/29).

#### 2. Programme of work

#### (a) Development of proposals for amending the AETR Agreement, including Article 22bis

Experts will be invited to continue to discuss, with a view towards finalizing, the proposed changes to Article 22bis as well as to Article 14 (to make regional economic integration organizations eligible to accede) based on the consolidated proposal in the annex of ECE/TRANS/SC.1/GE.21/20.

The Russian Federation will be invited to present an amendment proposal as discussed at the last session (ECE/TRANS/SC.1/GE.21/2016/1).

The Group of Experts will also invite the Joint Research Centre to provide information about the legal status of "Digital Tachograph System, European Root Policy, Version 2.1".

#### (b) Update of Amendment proposals of AETR, Article 14

The Group of Experts will be informed about the status of the amendment proposal to allow four non-UNECE member States to accede to the AETR Agreement.

#### (c) Application of Regulation (EC) No. 561/2006 in the "AETR area"

The Group of Experts will be invited to resume discussing the application of the Regulation 561/2006 given that the objective of amending the AETR Agreement in 2006 was to harmonize the two regimes for driving times and rest periods. The European Union will be invited to provide an update on the process of revising this Regulation and the outcome of the public consultations held in early 2016.

#### (d) Exchange of information on issuing digital tachograph cards

At the seventh session, experts agreed to support the tabling of an amendment proposal to introduce new Article 10bis (presented in the annex of ECE/TRANS/SC.1/GE.21/20). At this session, the AETR Contracting Parties will be invited to update the Group of Experts on any progress in this regard.

Turkey will be invited to inform the Group of Experts about its project to establish a national driving times and rest periods data monitoring centre (ECE/TRANS/SC.1/GE.21/26, para. 12). This briefing was postponed at the last session due to the unavailability of a Turkish expert.

## 3. EU Regulation No. 165/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council

AETR Contracting Parties may wish to discuss European Union Regulation No. 165/2014 and its impact (if any) on the AETR Agreement, including that related to establishing the Tachograph Forum (Article 43). At the last session, the European Commission was invited to prepare a document to ensure the implementation of the tachograph specifications based on the Regulation 165/2014 in the framework of the AETR Agreement. The Group of Experts may wish to discuss this document.

#### 4. Other business

The Group of Experts may wish to discuss other business.

## 5. Date and place of next meeting

The next meeting is scheduled for 24 October 2016 in Palais des Nations in Geneva.
