Thank you for your request for access to documents of the Council of the European Union<sup>1</sup>.

Rules of Procedure (Council Decision No 2009/937/EU, OJ L 325, 11.12.2009, p. 35).

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The General Secretariat of the Council has examined your request on the basis of the applicable rules: Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents (OJ L 145, 31.5.2001, p. 43) and the specific provisions concerning public access to Council documents set out in Annex II to the Council's

We have identified the following documents as related to your request:

- **8905/1/16 REV 1 ADD 1** Council mandate authorising the Commission to open negotiations on EU-level comprehensive air transport agreements with Qatar;
- 9081/1/16 REV 1 ADD 1 Council mandate authorising the Commission to open negotiations on EU-level comprehensive air transport agreements with the United Arab Emirates;
- **8914/1/16 REV 1 ADD 1** Council mandate authorising the Commission to open negotiations on EU-level comprehensive air transport agreements with Turkey;
- **8904/1/16 REV 1 ADD 1** Council mandate authorising the Commission to open negotiations on EU-level comprehensive air transport agreements with ASEAN.

The documents are classified and bear the 'RESTREINT UE/EU RESTRICTED' classification marking, which means that the unauthorised disclosure of its contents could be disadvantageous to the interests of the European Union or of one or more of its Member States<sup>2</sup>.

I regret to inform you that access to the documents requested cannot be given for the reasons set out below.

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Council Decision of 23 September 2013 on the security rules for protecting EU classified information (2013/488/EU), OJ L 274, 15.10.2013, p. 1.

On 7 June 2016 the Council adopted mandates authorising the Commission to open negotiations on EU-level comprehensive air transport agreements with four key partners: the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN), Qatar, the United Arab Emirates, and Turkey. The negotiations will be conducted by the Commission on behalf of the EU and its Member States.

Release of the information contained in these documents could impede the proper conduct of the negotiations and even weaken the position of the European Union in the framework of these negotiations, and would prejudice relations between the Union and the third countries concerned.

Disclosure of the documents requested would therefore undermine the protection of the public interest as regards international relations. As a consequence, the General Secretariat has to refuse access to those documents <sup>3</sup>.

You can ask the Council to review this decision within 15 working days of receiving this reply (confirmatory application). <sup>4</sup>

I am writing to you once again on behalf of Syndicat National des Pilotes de Ligne France ALPA following your letter refusing to publish the following documents:

- 8905/1/16 REV 1 ADD 1 Council mandate authorising the Commission to open negotiations on EU-level comprehensive air transport agreements with Qatar;
- 9081/1/16 REV 1 ADD 1 Council mandate authorising the Commission to open negotiations on EU-level comprehensive air transport agreements with the United Arab Emirates;
- 8914/1/16 REV 1 ADD 1 Council mandate authorising the Commission to open negotiations on EU-level comprehensive air transport agreements with Turkey;
- 8904/1/16 REV 1 ADD 1 Council mandate authorising the Commission to open negotiations on EU-level comprehensive air transport agreements with ASEAN.

As European aviation workers are directly affected by these negotiations which are decisive for the future of the sector in Europe, we would repeat our request for declassification. Now that the Council has finally published the mandate for negotiation on the TAFTA without disrupting the proper functioning of the transatlantic negotiations, the decision to keep these documents secret does not seem to be either justified or proportionate.
