Subject: COMMISSION DELEGATED REGULATION (EU) .../... of 12.9.2016 establishing detailed technical requirements and test procedures for the EC type-approval of motor vehicles with respect to their 112-based eCall in-vehicles systems, of 112-based eCall in-vehicle separate technical units and components and supplementing and amending Regulation (EU) 2015/758 of the European Parliament and of the Council with regard to the applicable standards
- Intention not to raise objections to a delegated act

1. The Commission has submitted the above delegated act to the Council in accordance with the procedure set out in Article 290(2)(b) TFEU and with regard to Articles 2(2), 5(8), 5(9) and 6(12) of Regulation (EU) No 2015/758 concerning type-approval requirements for the deployment of the eCall in-vehicle system based on the 112 service and amending Directive 2007/46/EC¹. The Commission having adopted the delegated act on 12 September 2016, the Council may object to it until 12 November 2016.
2. The Working Party on Technical Harmonisation (Motor Vehicles) has examined the delegated act by an electronic information procedure initiated on 12 September 2016 and silently agreed that there are no grounds for the Council to object to it.

3. It is therefore suggested that the Permanent Representatives Committee recommends to the Council to confirm that it has no intention to object to the delegated act and that the Commission and the European Parliament are to be informed thereof. This implies that, unless the European Parliament objects to it, the delegated act shall enter into force on the twentieth day following that of its publication in the Official Journal of the European Union in accordance with Article 10 of the Delegated Regulation.
