Subject: COMMISSION DELEGATED REGULATION (EU) .../... of 3.10.2016 on
the common monitoring and evaluation framework provided for in
Regulation (EU) No 514/2014 of the European Parliament and the Council
[laying down general provisions on the Asylum, Migration and Integration
Fund and on the instrument for financial support for police cooperation,
preventing and combating crime, and crisis management]
- Intention not to raise objection to a delegated act

1. On 3 October 2016, the Commission submitted to the Council the above-mentioned delegated act¹ in accordance with the procedure set out in Article 290 TFEU and with Article 58(4) of Regulation (EU) No 514/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 16 April 2014 laying down general provisions on the Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund and on the instrument for financial support for police cooperation, preventing and combating crime, and crisis management².

2. According to Article 58(5) of Regulation 514/2014, the Delegated Regulation shall enter into force only if no objection has been expressed either by the European Parliament or by the Council within two months of its notification. The period may be extended by two months at the initiative of the European Parliament or the Council. The Commission notified the Delegated Regulation to the Council on 3 October 2016.
 3. The Justice and Home Affairs Counsellors were consulted and no delegation considered that there would be grounds for the Council to object to it, neither has any delegation requested an extension of the deadline.
 4. It is therefore suggested that Coreper recommend that the Council confirm that it has no intention to object to the above mentioned delegated act and that the Commission and the European Parliament are to be informed thereof. This implies that, unless the European Parliament objects to it, the delegated act shall be published and enter into force in accordance with Article 58 of Regulation (EU) No 514/2014.
