Delegations will find attached the notification made by Hungary in relation to Framework Decision 2008/909/JHA on the application of the principle of mutual recognition to judgments in criminal matters imposing custodial sentences or measures involving deprivation of liberty for the purpose of their enforcement in the European Union.

This notification is also included in doc. 14288/13, comprising several notifications by Hungary, but is distributed in this individual format at the request and for the convenience of delegations.

Notification made by Hungary

Council Framework Decision 2008/909/JHA on the application of the principle of mutual recognition to judgments in criminal matters imposing custodial sentences or measures involving deprivation of liberty for the purpose of their enforcement in the European Union

(i) Hungary wishes to make the following declaration pursuant to **Article 7(4)** of the Framework Decision:

"Pursuant to Article 7(4) of the Council Framework Decision on the application of the principle of mutual recognition to judgments in criminal matters imposing custodial sentences or measures involving deprivation of liberty for the purpose of their enforcement in the European Union, Hungary declares that it will not apply Article 7(1) of that Framework Decision to the offences referred to therein."

(ii) Hungary wishes to make the following declaration pursuant to **Article 23(3)** of the Framework Decision:

"Pursuant to Article 23(3) of the Council Framework Decision on the application of the principle of mutual recognition to judgments in criminal matters imposing custodial sentences or measures involving deprivation of liberty for the purpose of their enforcement in the European Union, Hungary declares that it may, as an executing State, if it finds the content of the certificate insufficient to decide on the enforceability of the sentence, request, without delay after receiving the judgment and the certificate, that the judgment or essential parts of it be accompanied by a translation into Hungarian."
