- 1. On 28 September 2016, the European Commission adopted a Proposal for an Interinstitutional Agreement on a mandatory Transparency Register (IIA)¹.
- 2. On 3 November 2016, First Vice-President Frans TIMMERMANS addressed to Mr Ivan KORČOK, President in Office of the Council, a letter in which he invited the Council to nominate its representatives to the High Level Working Group which he proposed as a format for the future negotiations on the new IIA².
- 3. The General Affairs Group discussed the Council's draft reply at its meetings of 11 and 18 November and endorsed it on 23 November 2016 by silent procedure.
- 4. It is therefore suggested that the Permanent Representatives Committee approve the draft reply to FVP Timmermans, as set out in the Annex to this note, in accordance with the Council's rules of procedure (Article 19(7)(k)).
