OUTCOME OF PROCEEDINGS

From: Working Party for Schengen Matters (SIS/SIRENE/Mixed Committee EU-Iceland/Norway and Switzerland/Liechtenstein)

On: 5 February 2014

Subject: Summary of discussions

1. Adoption of the agenda

The agenda was adopted as set out in CM 1256/1/14, with one inclusion under item 10 (Any other business - see below).

2. Report by the Presidency

The Working Party took note of the report by the Presidency on the matters dealt with at the meeting of the Working Party for Schengen Matters (Schengen Evaluation) on 17 January 2014.

3. Management report on the implementation of the C.SIS installation and operation budget for 2012

The Presidency presented 17283/13 SIRIS 104 COMIX 673 + ADD 1.

The Working Party approved the Management Report.

4. Dismantling of C.SIS and keeping logs

The Presidency presented 15527/3/13 REV 3 SIRIS 88 SIS-TECH 60 COMIX 576. The Working Party confirmed the adoption of this document following the amendment of the text to include a new paragraph and other minor modifications, as agreed at the previous meeting.

5. Categorisation of missing minors alerts in SIS II

The Presidency presented 6015/14 SIRIS 9 COMIX 77, proposing an update to the categories of missing persons that may be entered in SIS II under Article 32 of the SIS II Decision¹ by adopting specific and common categories of missing minors.

CY, CZ, IE and LI took the floor to express their support for this initiative. DE said that while this was a good initiative, it was important to take account of legal aspects at national level. IT also showed support for the Presidency's initiative, referred to the work that it was carrying out on similar initiatives on missing minors and stated that this would be one of the priorities of the Italian Presidency during the second half of 2014.

COM stated that it was their objective to explore all the possibilities available in SIS II in relation to the protection of missing minors and alluded to DG Justice's work in that area.

The Presidency asked Member States to send in their comments by 7 March 2014.

6. Seminar on the use of Article 36 - SIS II

FR presented a Power Point presentation on the use of Article 36(2) and (3) of the SIS II Decision² by Member States and its impact in the statistic data since 2013.

FR also reported that it was organising a seminar for the delegates of the Working Party for Schengen Matters (Schengen Evaluation) and Terrorism Working Party with the aim of discussing the matter further. The provisional data for the seminar to take place is 9 April 2014. An invitation and agenda would be issued soon.

7. Report on the application of Article 102A of CISA for the year 2013

The General Secretariat of the Council (GSC) presented 14247/2/13 REV 2 SIRIS 85 SCHENGEN 34 ENFOPOL 308 COMIX 524.

The Working Party approved the report.

8. Statistics on hits for 2013 (1 January 2013 to 8 April 2013)

The GSC presented 14242/13 SIRIS 83 COMIX 522.

AT noted the existence of inconsistencies in the data presented in the report. GSC stated that the report was produced based on the data received; nevertheless, it asked Member States to review their data and send in any correction deemed necessary. A revised version would be issued and submitted to the Working Party for approval at the next meeting.

9. Global SIS Document

The GSC presented 5152/14 SIRIS 1 COMIX 11 + ADD 1 RESTREINT UE.

The Working Party took note of the update of the document.

10. Any other business

AT took the floor to express concerns regarding some questions arising from the technical preparations for the UK's accession to SIS II and asked the Presidency to prepare a document aimed at describing the main issues and their consequences. DE, CZ and LT supported AT's request. The UK made a formal statement, set out in DS 1052/14.

After some discussion it was agreed that Member States would send their comments on this issue to the Presidency.
