We have registered your request of 23 January 2014 for access to document COREU PAR 483/95. Thank you for your interest.

The General Secretariat of the Council has examined your request on the basis of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents<sup>1</sup> (hereafter the "Regulation") and specific provisions of the Council's Rules of Procedure<sup>2</sup> and has come to the following conclusion:

Document COREU PAR 483/95 (only available in French) contains guidelines for co-ordination of the participation of the European Union in the framework of the United Nations. You may have access to the content of this document with the exception of one part containing a position for internal use as part of deliberations and preliminary consultations within the Council, to which the General Secretariat cannot grant access in view of its specific content, pursuant to Article 4(3), second paragraph, of Regulation 1049/2001 (protection of the decision-making process of the Council).

TRANSLATION FROM GERMAN

Dear Sir/Madam, Dear Mr Thomsen,

I am writing to make a confirmatory application for full access to COREU PAR 483/95.

The right to full, free and unconditional access to information held by the European Union, in this case COREU PAR 483/95, follows from Article 15(3) TFEU, Article 42 of the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights and Article 2(1) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of 30 May 2001.

You have indicated that the redacted part is an opinion for internal use as part of deliberations and preliminary consultations within the Council after a decision had already been taken.

Since the Council has already taken a decision, there is no reason to believe that disclosure of the document would seriously undermine the institution's decision-making process. The refusal is based merely on hypothetical considerations. There is nothing to suggest that a negative impact is clearly foreseeable.

In the present case, when the need for confidentiality is weighed against public interest in access to COREU PAR 483/95, the result is in favour of the overriding public interest in access. The general principle of granting the public the widest possible access to documents must be applied in this case.

In principle, only the interest in access expressed in the basic constitutional decision in favour of the greatest possible freedom of information should be considered when weighing up the arguments. However, according to the case-law of the General Court, the institutions of the Union are required to take into account particular access interests of individuals of whom they are aware.

In the present case, the applicant has a particular interest in access. The applicant is a research associate at the German Research Institute for Public Administration Speyer. The Research Institute is a non-university institution which does application-oriented fundamental research in the field of administrative sciences. Specifically, the applicant manages the research project "Policy implementation in the international context in mixed fora; mechanisms for coordination between the Commission and Member States when implementing international harmonisation commitments: procedures and deficiencies" (project headed by **DELETED**).

The research project involves studying interinstitutional agreements which govern the coordination of the EU and Member States in international organisations. COREU PAR 483/95 is a policy document of this type which comments on EU coordination within the framework of the United Nations. For this reason, full access to this document is of great scientific interest for the purposes of fundamental research into the coordination between the EU and Member States, and therefore a decision should be made in favour of full access.

I hereby request the removal of personal data from Council documents in the public register of Council documents.
