Subject: 1541st meeting of the Special Committee on Agriculture (SCA) held in Brussels on 16th January 2017

SUMMARY

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1. <u>Adoption of the agenda</u>

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The agenda was adopted. At the request of the Belgian delegation, <u>the SCA</u> agreed to add an any other business item.

3. <u>Presentation of the Presidency Work Programme</u>

<u>The SCA</u> took note of the Presidency Work Programme (with a special emphasis being put on the foreseen schedules for the Organic and Omnibus dossiers), as well as of the comments made by delegations and the Commission.

4. Market situation and the milk package report

<u>The SCA</u> took note of the presentation provided by the Commission of two proposals for Council Decisions on the signing and conclusion of the EU/Chile trade agreement on organic products. Both texts, including the agreement itself, have received the support from the Member States, although a few delegations regretted not having been informed at an early stage of the negotiations. In order to streamline the procedure of adoption of these texts, the Presidency requested any linguistic remarks to be submitted before the end of the week and provided some information on the next steps.

<u>The SCA</u> took note of the information provided by the Commission, as well as of the views expressed by delegations and of the question suggested by the Presidency for the debate at the "Agriculture and Fisheries" Council. 8. a) Scope of the Commission's powers to adopt delegated acts for exceptions from the rules on protected designations of origin for wines

Request from the Slovenian delegation
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<u>The SCA</u> took note of the concerns expressed, of the Commission's and of delegations' comments. This item will appear as an AOB on the "Agriculture and Fisheries" Council agenda on 23 January next.

b) Import of organic salmon from Norway

= Request from the Belgian delegation

The Belgian delegation reminded <u>the SCA</u> that Norway and Iceland did not agree to incorporate the EU legislation on organic aquaculture in the EEA agreement and that the transitional period has expired since 2015. As a consequence the certification of Norwegian/Iceland organic aquaculture products cannot be carried out in accordance with the relevant EU legislation.

It also informed the SCA that it had taken the necessary measures to prevent aquaculture products from Norway and Iceland from being put on the market as organic. Apparently, this is not the case in all Member States and this creates a distortion of the market which can be damageable for the Belgian operators. BE was supported by several delegations.

The Commission insisted on the fact that all EU competent authorities should adopt the same logic on this dossier and should ask their competent authorities to block the import of salmon from Norway and Iceland labelled as organic. The Commission also clarified that all organic aquaculture products are concerned by this measure.

9. Organisation of future work

The Presidency informed <u>the SCA</u> about the "Agriculture and Fisheries" Council of 23 January 2017. Some delegations (SK, SI and PL) confirmed or informed about AOB requests. The Presidency also informed the SCA about the next SCA meeting on 13 February 2017.
