Subject: Forensic Training for Law Enforcement Officers

- **Introduction**

As stated in Article 3 of Regulation 2015/2219 on the European Union Agency for Law Enforcement Training, CEPOL is the agency responsible for supporting, developing, implementing and coordinating training for law enforcement officials. CEPOL is mandated to develop, implement and coordinate training addressing specific criminal or policing thematic areas, such as forensic training.

On 9-10 June 2016, the Justice and Home Affairs Council Ministers endorsed the Council Conclusions and Action Plan on the way forward for the creation of a European Forensic Science Area.¹ Action 4 of the said Action Plan aims to improve forensic awareness among law enforcement authorities. This will foster better understanding and confidence among the forensic service providers.

Whilst recognising the efforts undertaken in this field to develop training, there are still significant gaps between training needs and training currently available in the area of forensics. In light of this, the Maltese Presidency will undertake a quantitative assessment of the forensic training needs in the medium-term covering a 3-year period (2018 – 2020). The questionnaire covers the whole process of crime scene investigation starting from the actions of the first responders until the presentation of evidence in court. This questionnaire is one of a series that is being sent out by the Maltese Presidency to target the training needs of practitioners in their respective fields. Similar questionnaires have been disseminated within the DAPIX² and SIS/SIRENE working parties.³

In an effort to identify the relevant forensic training needs, Member States are invited to reply to this questionnaire and send their replies to the Council Secretariat (lewp@consilium.europa.eu) or the Presidency (lewp.mhas@gov.mt) by **28 February 2017**. The results will be presented at the Law Enforcement Working Party and will form the basis for further work during the Maltese Presidency, and contribute to the CEPOL Training Programme.

- **Scope**

The objective of this exercise is to enable CEPOL to better meet the training needs of Member States and to develop efficient, targeted approach to training on a specialised, thematic level. This will raise the effectiveness of law enforcement across the EU and it will stimulate the development of a harmonised law enforcement culture.

- **Intended Audience**

This questionnaire is aimed at managers and/or senior officers responsible for the provision of forensic services.

- **Level of Training**

The adherence to the Law Enforcement Training Scheme (LETS) general principles, namely strands, ensures that EU level training for law enforcement officials is of high quality, coherent and consistent. Therefore, training programmes mentioned in the questionnaire are targeted at specialists/officers with a considerable amount of expertise and experience within the specific field. The awareness raising and basic first responders training has to be carried out at a national level. CEPOL's offered training has to be complementary to the national training.

2.1 Train the Trainer Course on Awareness raising for front-line officers, investigating officers and emergency responders

This training would prepare the trainers to further deliver training as foreseen in the Action 4.6 of the Action Plan on the way forward for the creation of a European Forensic Science Area.

Action 4.6 states that courses on forensic awareness for members of emergency services and other first responders should be developed. This training would cover the actions and steps that the first responders to a crime scene should carry out, in particular how to detect, secure and preserve the evidence until crime scene experts arrive at the scene.
