The Council welcomes the Court's opinion that, in all material respects, the Executive Agency's annual accounts present fairly its financial position as at 31 December 2015 and the results of its operations and its cash flows for the year then ended, in accordance with the provisions of the Executive Agency's Financial Regulation, and that the underlying transactions for 2015 are legal and regular in all material respects. Nevertheless, one observation needs to be made.

While acknowledging that the high level of commitment appropriations carried over to 2016 is mainly explained by the Commission's late issuing of the Executive Agency's work plan, but also by the extension of the Executive Agency's office space and the required fitting out of premises, the Council encourages the Executive Agency to continue improving its financial programming and monitoring of the budget implementation, in order to reduce the level of commitments carried over to the following financial year to the minimum strictly necessary, in line with the budgetary principle of annuality, and to avoid the cancellation of appropriations.
