EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

- 1. By its Decision 2004/576/EC of 29.04.2004 the Council concluded the Agreement for scientific and technical cooperation between the European Community and Israel, which entered into force on 12.05.2004, with a provisional application on 16.12.2002.
- 2. The Agreement associated Israel to the specific programmes of the Sixth Framework Programme of the European Community for research, technological development and demonstration (RTD) activities. Article 5(5) of this Agreement foresees the renewal of the Agreement should the Community adopt new Framework Programmes.
- 3. It is in the interest of the Communities to renegotiate this Agreement in order to associate Israel to the Seventh Framework Programme and thereby expand the European Research Area.
- 4. In the light of the above, the Commission recommends that:
 - the Council authorises the Commission to open and conduct negotiations with Israel on the renewal under mutually agreed conditions of the agreement on scientific and technical cooperation covering the activities of the European Community's framework programme for research, technological development and demonstration activities;
 - since, in accordance with Article 300, paragraph 1, of the EC Treaty, the Commission will conduct these negotiations on behalf of the European Community, the Council appoints a special committee to assist it in this task; and
 - the Council adopts the negotiating directives in the Annex.

COUNCIL DECISION

authorising the Commission to negotiate the renewal of the agreement on scientific and technical cooperation between the European Community and the State of Israel

- (1) The Council authorises the Commission to negotiate the renewal of the agreement for scientific and technical cooperation between the European Community and the State of Israel.
- (2) The Commission will conduct the negotiations with the assistance of the special committee created for this purpose in accordance with Article 300, paragraph 1, of the Treaty establishing the European Community.
- (3) The Council calls on the Commission to conduct these negotiations on the basis of the negotiating directives in the Annex.
- (4) The Commission will keep the Council informed of the state of progress of the negotiations.

ANNEX

DRAFT NEGOTIATING DIRECTIVES

For renewing the Agreement for scientific and technical cooperation between the European Community and the State of Israel

The aim of the negotiations is to renew under mutually agreed conditions the above-mentioned Agreement for the duration of the Seventh Framework Programme (EC - 2007-2013)², and this in accordance with the procedure foreseen under Article 5, paragraph 5 of the Agreement.

The terms and conditions of the present Agreement will be adapted to the rules applicable to the Seventh Framework Programme for research, technological development and demonstration activities, once it is adopted. It would be appropriate to foresee the provisional application of the renewed agreement so as to allow Israeli entities to participate in the first calls under the Seventh Framework Programmes.

The renewed agreement should provide for adequate protection of the financial interests of the European Communities covering the communication of financial data, audits and administrative anti-fraud investigations on the spot, administrative assistance and the recovery of money. Insofar as necessary, the renewed agreement should also envisage elimination of obstacles in relation to taxation and social security resulting from the cross border participation of researchers in research projects under the agreement, in particular for the personnel of the Joint Research Centres governed by the EC staff regulations.
