Thank you for your request for access to documents of the Council of the European Union.¹

I regret to inform you that access to document 15253/16 cannot be given for the reasons set out below.

Document **15253/16** is a note from the Presidency to delegations concerning *Solidarity and responsibility in the Common European Asylum System* and contains a *Progress report by the Slovak Presidency*. This document concerns an issue which is still subject to difficult discussions within the Council and its preparatory bodies.

The General Secretariat of the Council has examined your request on the basis of the applicable rules: Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents (OJ L 145, 31.5.2001, p. 43) and the specific provisions concerning public access to Council documents set out in Annex II to the Council's Rules of

The documents gives details of progress made and reflects the difficulties that still need to be addressed before solutions can be found. Release to the public of the information contained in it would disrupt the negotiating process and jeopardise the chances of the Council reaching an agreement.

Disclosure of the document at this stage would therefore seriously undermine the decision making-process of the Council.

Having examined the context in which the document was drafted and the current state of play on this matter, on balance the General Secretariat could not identify any evidence suggesting an overriding public interest in its disclosure.

As a consequence, the General Secretariat has to refuse access to the document at this stage.²

We have also looked into the possibility of releasing parts of the document.³ However, as the information contained in the document forms an inseparable whole, the General Secretariat is also unable to give partial access to it at this stage.

You can ask the Council to review this decision within 15 working days of receiving this reply (confirmatory application).⁴
