Subject:	European Court of Auditors' special report n  31: 'Spending at least one euro in every five from the EU budget on climate action: ambitious work underway, but serious risk of falling short'
	- Draft Council conclusions

- 1. On 26 October 2016, Members of the Court of Auditors adopted the special no 31: 'Spending at least one euro in every five from the EU budget on climate action: ambitious work underway, but serious risk of falling short'<sup>1</sup>. On 22 November 2016, the European Court of Auditors' published that report.
- 2. On 25 January 2017, under the rules laid down in the Council conclusions on improving the examination of special reports drown up by the Court of Auditors<sup>2</sup>, the Permanent Representatives Committee instructed the Working Party of Financial Counsellors to examine the report<sup>3</sup>.
- 3. On 14 February 2017, a representatives of the Court of Auditors presented the special report no 31 to the Financial Counsellors. At its meeting on 27 February 2017, the Financial Counsellors examined a draft set of Council conclusions on the above report<sup>4</sup>.
