Subject:	Proposal for a COUNCIL IMPLEMENTING DECISION establishing a list of non-cooperating third countries in fighting IUU fishing pursuant to Council Regulation (EC) No 1005/2008 establishing a Community system to prevent, deter and eliminate illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing - adoption

- 1. The <u>European Commission</u> submitted the above proposal on 26 November 2013 to the Council.
- 2. The proposal is to be seen in the context of the Commission's decision of 15 November 2012¹ to inform eight countries of the possibility of their identification as countries that the Commission considers as non-cooperating under the Council Regulation (EC) No 1005/2008 on establishing a Community system to prevent, deter and eliminate illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing (IUU fishing). Following a close dialogue with those eight countries, the Commission on 26 November 2013² decided to identify three of them, namely Belize, Cambodia and Guinea-Conakry.

- 3. The current proposal envisages the public listing of those three countries by Council implementing decision. After a Council decision, the Commission would publish the list and a series of measures would apply in the bilateral relations with those countries, in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 1005/2008.
- 4. The <u>United Kingdom, French and Danish delegations</u> entered parliamentary scrutiny reserves which in the meantime have been lifted.
- 5. The Working Party on Internal and External Fisheries Policy discussed the proposal between 4 December 2013 and 26 February 2014. The Commission representative informed the Working Party about the continuing bilateral dialogues, which had shown some progress in respect of Belize and particularly Guinea-Conakry, but not sufficient to remedy the situation in the near future.
- 6. Under these circumstances, the <u>Permanent Representatives Committee</u> is invited to suggest that <u>Council</u>, at one of its forthcoming meetings, <u>decide</u> on a list of non-cooperating third countries as set out in document ST 6262/14 PECHE 61 (lawyer-linguists' document).
