Subject: Proposal for a Regulation of the European Parliament and of the Council establishing a European Neighbourhood Instrument (**first reading**)
- Adoption of the legislative act (**LA + S**)

1. On 9 December 2011 the Commission submitted the above proposal¹, based on Articles 209(1) and 212(2) of the TFEU, to the Council.
2. The Committee of the Regions delivered its opinion on 9 October 2012². The European Economic and Social Committee delivered its opinion on 14 November 2012³.

3. In accordance with the provisions of the Joint Declaration on practical arrangements for the codecision procedure¹, informal contacts were initiated between the Council, the European Parliament and the Commission with the aim of reaching agreement at first reading.
4. The European Parliament adopted its position at first reading on 11 December 2013, making one amendment to the Commission proposal. The outcome of voting in the European Parliament reflects the compromise agreement reached between the institutions and should, therefore, be acceptable to the Council².
5. The Permanent Representatives Committee is therefore asked to confirm its agreement and to suggest that the Council:
 - approve the European Parliament's position, as set out in PE-CONS 126/13, as an "A" item at a forthcoming meeting, with the United Kingdom delegation voting against;
 - order that the statements in the addendum to this note be entered in the minutes of that meeting and published in the Official Journal of the European Union together with the legislative act.

If the Council approves the European Parliament's position, the legislative act will be adopted.

After being signed by the President of the European Parliament and the President of the Council, the legislative act will be published in the Official Journal of the European Union.
