Subject:	Network Security Incident Alert Mechanism

- In 2010 the Council established a Network Security Incident Alert Mechanism (NSIAM) with the aim of providing alerts on security incidents on networks linking the Council, other institutions and bodies and Member States (doc. 8184/2/10 REV 2, RESTREINT UE/EU RESTRICTED).
- Over the past six years, the mechanism has largely been used by the GSC to notify Member States and institutional partners about incidents affecting GSC systems.
 In 2011, a Computer Emergency Response Team for EU institutions, bodies and agencies (CERT-EU) was established. The GSC now provides incident information to CERT-EU. It is understood that Member State CERTs are now receiving the same level of information as the participants of the alert mechanism.
- To avoid duplication, the Council Security Committee agreed on14 February 2017 to discontinue the Network Security Incident Alert Mechanism (NSIAM) as of 1 July 2017, on the understanding that Member States continue to receive appropriate information through CERT-EU.
- In the light of the above, and subject to confirmation by COREPER, the Council is invited to agree that the alert mechanism set out in doc. 8184/2/10 REV2, RESTREINT UE/EU RESTRICTED be discontinued.
