d) Detailed grounds for the transfer

On 25 January 2017, the European Commission adopted the Communication "Migration on the Central Mediterranean route - managing flows, saving lives", JOIN(2017) 4 final. It foresees EUR 200 million to be mobilised in 2017 for the North Africa Window of the Africa Trust Fund with a priority focus on migration-related projects concerning Libya, while enhancing in parallel operational cooperation on migration flows management with neighbouring countries.

The Instrument contributing to Stability and Peace is proposed to contribute EUR 13 million for the implementation of this Communication, to be channelled first through the European Neighbourhood Instrument and then to the Africa Trust Fund.
