Subject: COMMISSION DELEGATED REGULATION (EU) .../... of 2.6.2017  
amending Annexes I and II to Regulation (EU) No 510/2011 of the  
European Parliament and of the Council for the purpose of adapting them  
to the change in the regulatory test procedure for the measurement of CO<sub>2</sub>  
from light commercial vehicles  
- Intention not to raise objection to a delegated act

---

1. The Commission has submitted the above delegated act<sup>1</sup> to the Council in accordance with the procedure set out in Article 290 TFEU and in particular the second subparagraph of Article 8(9) and the fourth subparagraph of Article 13(6) of Regulation (EU) No 510/2011 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 11 May 2011 setting emission performance standards for new light commercial vehicles as part of the Union's integrated approach to reduce CO<sub>2</sub> emissions from light-duty vehicles<sup>2</sup>. The Commission having notified the delegated act on 2 June 2017, the Council may object to it until 2 August 2017.

2. The Working Party on Environment has examined the delegated act and agreed that there are no grounds for the Council to object it.
  3. It is therefore suggested that Coreper recommends that the Council confirms that it has no intention to object to the delegated act and that the Commission and the European Parliament are to be informed thereof. This implies that, unless the European Parliament objects to it, the delegated act shall be published and enter into force on the twentieth day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Union in accordance with Article 2 of the Delegated Regulation.
