Subject: Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) .../... of 22.8.2017 amending Delegated Regulation (EU) No 522/2014 supplementing Regulation (EU) No 1301/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council with regard to the detailed rules concerning the principles for the selection and management of innovative actions in the area of sustainable urban development to be supported by the European Regional Development Fund  
- Intention not to raise objections to a delegated act

---

1. The Commission submitted the delegated act in subject<sup>1</sup> to the Council in accordance with Article 290 TFEU and Articles 8(3) and 14 of Regulation (EU) No 1301/2013<sup>2</sup>. The Commission having notified the delegated act on 22 August 2017, the Council may object to it until 22 October 2017.

2. The Working Party on Structural Measures examined the delegated act in question on 5 September 2017 and all delegations, except one delegation, which entered a scrutiny reservation, agreed that there are no grounds for the Council to object to the delegated act. The above-mentioned delegation lifted its scrutiny reservation on 8 September 2017.
  3. It is therefore suggested that Coreper recommend that the Council confirm that it has no intention to object to the delegated act and that the Commission and the European Parliament are to be informed thereof. This implies that, unless the European Parliament objects to it, the delegated act shall be published and enter into force in accordance with Article 14(5) of Regulation (EU) No 1301/2013 .
